Game 1

Montana 78, SE Missouri St. 63
Nov. 16, 2001 • Edinburg, Texas
UTPA Lady Bronc Classic

Opening the season away from home for the first time in five years, Montana defeated Southeast Missouri State 78-63 in the opening round of the Texas-Pan American Lady Bronc Classic.

The Lady Griz shot well from the field at the outset of the game. The Lady Griz raced out to a quick 8-0 lead in the first three minutes of the contest. The lead eventually grew to 17 at 25-8 with 8:45 left in the half.

Southeast Missouri State cut the lead to 36-28 early in the second half, but Montana responded by outscoring the Otahkians 32-11 to open up a 29-point lead at 68-39 with 8:17 left to play.

Montana shot 56.4 percent (31-for-55) from the field, including 59 percent in the second half. Senior **Cheryl Keller** led the way with a career-high 22 points. She was 9-for-13 from the floor, including 4-for-4 from 3-point range. **Julie Deming** also had a strong night, sinking five of six shots to finish with 10 points. Freshman **Hollie Tyler** had a successful debut, coming off the bench to score 14 points and grab 10 rebounds.

Montana 77, Ark.-Little Rock 57

UTPA Lady Bronc Classic

Montana used a fast start to gain control of the game and defeat Arkansas-Little Rock to win the Texas-Pan American Lady Bronc Classic.

The Lady Griz jumped out to a 13-4 lead in the first five minutes of the game. Although the Trojans closed the gap to three points at 15-12, Montana quickly regained control to take a 45-27 lead at halftime. The Lady Griz led by at least 13 points the rest of the game.

Montana finished the night shooting 43.9 percent (29-for-66) from the field. The Lady Griz were dangerous behind the 3-point line, connecting on seven of 12 attempts.

Hollie Tyler led five players in double figures with 21 points and 12 rebounds. **Simarron Schildt**, **Julie Deming**, **Cheryl Keller** and **Laura Valley** all scored 10 points for the Lady Griz. Keller also added a team-high five assists.

Tyler was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player, while Keller joined her on the All-Tournament Team.

Game 3

W. Kentucky 73, Montana 70
Nov. 24, 2001 • Missoula, Mont.

Cheryl Keller scored 21 points, and **Hollie Tyler** came off the bench to score 13 points and grab 11 rebounds, but it wasn't quite enough as the University of Montana fell to Western Kentucky 73-70.

Keller also had the defensive assignment of stopping Western Kentucky's All-America candidate Natalie Powers. Powers entered the game averaging 21 points per game. But she scored only six points on 3-for-12 shooting.

The game was tied 69-69 with 1:52 left, but WKU's Shala Reese converted two layups to give the Lady Toppers a 73-69 lead with 35 seconds remaining. UM's **Brooklynn Lorenzen** then converted one of two free throws to make it a three-point game.

Western Kentucky's Jamie Truitt then missed the front end of a one-and-one with 15 seconds left to give Montana one last chance. But Lorenzen's last-second 3-point attempt didn't draw iron.

Laura Valley joined Keller and Tyler in double figures with 10 points. She also had eight rebounds. As a team, Montana outrebounded Western Kentucky 46-30.

Montana 75, Washington St. 51
Dec. 1, 2001 • Pullman, Wash.

Montana picked up an impressive road win by defeating Washington State 75-51 in Pullman, Wash.

The Lady Griz controlled the game from the outset, scoring the first nine points of the game en route to a 23-4 lead with just under 12 minutes to play in the first half.

Washington State scored seven straight points to end the half, making the score 38-26. The Cougars then scored the first two points of the second half to cut Montana's lead to a 10-point deficit, but that would be as close as the hosts would get. Montana went on a 9-0 run to increase their advantage back to 19 points.

Cheryl Keller led the Lady Griz by scoring a game-high 21 points. She also collected a career-high eight steals. As a team, Montana recorded 18 steals and forced 25 turnovers.

Junior **Julie Deming** scored 14 points, while freshman **Hollie Tyler** added 11 points. **Laura Valley** came off the bench to score 10 points and grab a team-high eight rebounds.

Game 5

Montana 62, UM-Western 46
Dec. 4, 2001 • Missoula, Mont.

Montana relied on its defense to overcome a poor shooting night to defeat the University of Montana-Western 62-46.

The Lady Griz shot a season-low 35 percent from the field, but they held Montana-Western to only 37 percent shooting.

Montana built a 21-10 lead with 11:23 left in the first half. Vanika Dickerson nailed a 3-pointer at the 10:20 mark to make the score 21-13, but it would be the last Montana-Western field goal for the next eight minutes. However, the Lady Bulldogs stayed in the game by making seven straight free throws.

Montana struggled offensively in the second half, making only 11 of 35 field goal attempts (31 percent). But the Lady Griz defense responded by holding the Lady Bulldogs to only nine field goals.

Simarron Schildt led the Lady Griz by coming off the bench to score 11 points and grab nine rebounds. **Julie Deming** finished with 10 points.

Montana dominated the boards. The Lady Griz hauled down 50 rebounds, including 28 at the offensive end, compared to only 24 for the Lady Bulldogs.

Montana 75, MSU-Billings 56

Guard **Cheryl Keller** scored 18 points while centers **Hollie Tyler** and **Crystal Baird** combined for 27 points as Montana downed Montana State-Billings 75-56.

Baird sparked the Lady Griz in the first half by coming off the bench to score 11 of her career-high 13 points in the first 20 minutes. Keller and Tyler warmed up in the second half. Keller scored 11 points in the second half, including a four-point play. Tyler added eight points in the second half to finish with 14.

Montana never trailed in the contest. With the score tied 4-4, the Lady Griz scored nine unanswered points to take a 13-4 lead with 15:30 left in the first half. MSU-Billings trimmed the deficit to 17-12, but Montana answered with a 16-5 outburst to take its largest lead of the half at 33-17 with 3:26 on the clock. Baird fueled the rally with seven points.

The Lady Griz put the game out of reach midway through the second half. Leading 52-37, Montana outscored the Yellowjackets 17-4 to take its largest lead of the game at 69-41 with five minutes to play. Keller contributed nine points in the rally, while Tyler added four points.

Game 7

Montana 92, Houston 73

Mississippi State Classic

Montana erupted for 55 second-half points as the Lady Griz defeated Houston 93-72 in the first round of the Mississippi State Classic.

Montana led only by three points at halftime, 38-35, before catching fire in the second half. With the score tied 40-40 early in the second half, UM freshman center **Crystal Baird** scored the first seven points of a 9-2 run which gave the Lady Griz a little breathing room at 49-42.

Following two free throws by Houston's Valerie Muoneke, Montana reeled off 21 unanswered points to break the game open at 70-44 with approximately 9 minutes left in the game.

Montana made 20 of 32 (62.5 percent) of its shots in the second half, and finished 37 of 69 (53.6 percent) for the game. Houston, now 6-2, shot 25-for-57 (43.9 percent) for the contest.

Senior **Cheryl Keller** paced Montana with a career high 23 points, including 12 in the second half. Three other players scored in double figures, led by **Julie Deming** with 15 points. Baird and **Simarron Schildt** added 11 and 10 points, respectively.

Miss. State 78, Montana 73 OT

Nov. 16, 2001 • Miss. State, Miss.

Mississippi State Classic

Cheryl Keller equaled her career-high of 23 points and **Julie Deming** added a career-high 17 points, but it wasn't quite enough as Mississippi State edged Montana 78-73 in overtime in the championship game of the Mississippi State Classic.

Montana trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half, but managed to trim the deficit to four, 36-32, at halftime. Mississippi State pushed the lead back to 10 at 44-34 with 18 minutes to play before Montana scored 10 unanswered points to tie the game at 44-44 with 14 minutes to play.

MSU later led 58-56 with 3:30 remaining, but Deming sank a 3-pointer and **Simarron Schildt** made a jumper to give Montana a 61-58 lead with 1:38 to play.

MSU's All-American forward LaToya Thomas answered with a traditional 3-point play to tie the score 61-61 with 1:21 left.

In overtime, Mississippi State collected six of their 26 offensive rebounds and converted those extra scoring chances into eight points.
