



GRIZ FOOTBALL 2008 WRAP-UP

*Montana Plays for FCS National Championship/
Finishes 14-2/Wins 11th Straight League Title*

MONTANA PLAYS FOR NATIONAL TITLE/ WINS 14 GAMES & LEAGUE CROWN/

RANKED SECOND IN SPORTS NETWORK'S FINAL POLL: The University of Montana Grizzlies played for the 2008 Football Championship Subdivision title, losing 24-7 to Richmond; had an overall record of 14-2 and 7-1 (first) in the Big Sky Conference; and was ranked second in the nation in the *Sports Network's* final poll.

ANOTHER BIG SKY CHAMPIONSHIP!: Montana has now won (or shared) 11 Big Sky championships in a row --- the second longest streak in FBS/FCS history. The Grizzlies passed BYU, which won or tied for 10 WAC titles from 1976-85. The record is held by Oklahoma, which won 14 league titles in a row from 1946-59.

GRIZ WIN 14 OR MORE GAMES FOR THIRD TIME: The 2008 Griz team was only the third in school history to win 14 or more games. Montana was 14-1 in 1996, 15-1 in 2001, and 14-2 this season.

PLAYOFF VETERANS: Montana has now played in **44 playoff games**, and has advanced to the FCS championship game six times. The 2008 season was the **16th year in a row** for the Grizzlies in the playoffs, a record, and their 19th overall (which ties Eastern Kentucky for most playoff appearances).

RECORD-SETTING CROWDS!: Montana set three Big Sky attendance records in 2008: single-season regular-season (seven games) home attendance (**174,236**) and regular-season attendance average (**24,891**), and largest crowd for a non-conference home game (**25,326** vs. Central Washington).

MONTANA SETS BIG SKY MARK FOR CONSECUTIVE REGULAR-SEASON VICTORIES: Montana set a conference record for most consecutive regular-season wins with **25**, dating back to Sept. 9, 2006 to Sept. 27th of 2008. The Grizzlies also tied their own league record with **11 regular-season wins** in 2008.

BERGQUIST IN THE RECORD BOOK: Senior quarterback **Cole Berquist's (San Clemente, Calif.)** finished his career ranked among Montana's all-time leaders in numerous categories. His 58 career touchdown passes rank him third in school history, while his 7,505 career passing yards rank him fourth. (His other rankings are listed in this release).

REYNOLDS BREAKS RUSH TD MARK: Sophomore halfback **Chase Reynolds (Drummond)** rushed for a school-record 22 touchdowns in 2008, and his 1,583 rushing yards are the second most ever and the 13th most in Big Sky history.

SCHULTE 9TH IN ALL-PURPOSE YARDS: Senior wide receiver/returner **Rob Schulte (Great Falls)** ended ninth in career all-purpose yards with 3,094.

ANDERSON IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Senior strong safety **Colt Anderson** ended up fifth on Montana's career tackles list with 313. **Anderson's** 129 tackles in 2008 are the eighth most in Big Sky history, while his 18 tackles at James Madison in UM's 2008 FCS semifinal game tie him for the 11th most ever by a Big Sky player in a game.

MARIANIES LEAGUE MARK FOR PUNT RETURN TOUCHDOWN: Junior wide receiver **Marc Mariani's (Havre)** 94-yard punt return for a touchdown against Idaho State IN 2008 tied the Big Sky record set by former Montana cornerback Tuff Harris in 2006 at Eastern Washington).

GRIZ BY THE NUMBERS

2nd-In the nation Montana was ranked in attendance in the FCS at 23,923 in nine home games, while Appalachian State was first, averaging 25,161 in eight home contests.

SAN LOUIS OBISPO, CALIF. – Fifth-ranked Montana opened the 2008 season with a key road win over 11th-ranked Cal Poly on Saturday night, a 30-28 victory at Alex G. Spanos Stadium.

The Grizzlies, up by just two points with no timeouts left and 38 seconds left on the game clock, watched as Cal Poly kicker Andrew Gardner, lined up for a 27-yard field goal attempt. Gardner, who hit the game winner against San Diego State last week, wasn't able to do it again when he pulled it wide left.

Montana senior running back Andrew Schmidt carried the ball 26 times for 145 yards and a touchdown. Quarterback Cole Bergquist completed 13-of-22 passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns, both scoring strikes to receiver Mike Ferriter.

Cal Poly quarterback Jonathan Dally completed 16-of-23 passes for 248 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Ramses Barden caught both those touchdown passes and caught seven balls for 131 yards.

Montana's defense forced Cal Poly to punt on its first possession. Schmidt blocked the game's first punt, giving his offense field position on Cal Poly's 39-yard line.

Montana's first offensive play resulted in a quick six points when Bergquist connected with Ferriter on a 34-yarder for the game's first score.

The Mustangs quickly fired back with a score of their own when Dally connected with Barden up the middle on a play action pass, tying the game at 7-7 late in the first quarter.

Bergquist put Montana up 14-7 after scampering 15 yards for a score on a quarterback draw. The scoring drive followed a Cal Poly shanked punt.

Dally threw a strike to Barden on a post pattern, tying Montana again at 14-14 early in the second quarter.

Cal Poly took its first lead of the game with six minutes left in the first half when wingback James Noble scored from two yards out, making it 21-14.

In the second half Schmidt rushed eight times for 54 yards on the first drive. Bergquist then hit Ferriter from 20 yards out to tie the game at 21-apiece. The 12-play, 80-yard drive that took 5:50 was kept alive by Bergquist who was able to convert two huge fourth down runs.

After Montana's special teams pinned the Mustangs deep in their territory, Grizzly linebacker Brandon Fisher stripped the ball out of Dally's hands, which Cal Poly recovered in the endzone resulting in a safety, giving Montana a two-point lead at 23-21.

Early in the fourth quarter, Montana, for the third time in the game, went for it on fourth down, with Schmidt pounding it up the middle for a first down by mere inches. The next play, Bergquist went to the air for a 26-yard completion to Marc Mariani giving UM a first-and-goal from the five yard line. Schmidt capped off the drive with a five-yard TD rush, making it 30-21, Griz.

With 8:32 left, Cal Poly put together an impressive 12-play, 72-yard drive, Noble scoring from 2 yards out, cutting the UM lead to 30-28.

With 5:47 remaining, Montana went for it again on fourth down. This time, Cal Poly came up big by sacking Bergquist and giving their offense a chance to take back the lead. Down by only two, the potent and experienced Mustang offense drove down the field to Montana's 9-yard line with just 38 seconds left on the clock. Montana forced Cal Poly to kick a field goal from 27 yards away, but Gardner pulled the kick left, sending the Montana sideline into a frenzy as they knew all the offense had to do was run out the clock for the victory.

MISSOULA, MT (9/13/08) – University of Montana junior wide receiver Marc Mariani tied a school record with four touchdown receptions; sophomore quarterback Andrew Selle threw four touchdown passes; and UM tied a school record with six scoring passes, as the fifth-ranked Grizzlies defeated the Southern Utah Thunderbirds 46-10 Saturday afternoon in a non-conference game in UM’s Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

A record crowd of 25,056 was on hand to see the Grizzlies win their 2008 season opener in expanded Washington-Grizzly Stadium breaking the old attendance mark of 24,018 set against Montana State in 2006.

It was a lack-luster first quarter by both teams and there was no scoring, but Montana (2-0) of the Big Sky Conference outscored Southern Utah (1-2) of the Great West Conference 23-0 in the second stanza and never looked back.

In that second quarter, the Grizzlies scored on touchdown passes of 14 and 66 yards from senior quarterback Cole Bergquist to Mariani, while Selle connected with “true” freshman Jabin Sambrano on a 15-yard scoring pass. Freshman kicker Russell Schey opened the scoring in the second period with his first career field goal, a 30-yarder. The Grizzlies out-gained the T-Birds 231 to 79 in total yards in the first half, and had 11 (13 to two) more first downs.

Montana tacked on 10 more unanswered points in the third quarter, as Mariani and Selle hooked up for a 32-yard scoring pass and senior wide receiver Mike Ferriter booted a 27-yard field goal – the first three-point attempt of his career. That made it 32-0 Grizzlies after three periods. The Griz went ahead 39-zip on a 14-yard touchdown throw from Selle to senior wide receiver Rob Schulte with 13:26 left to go in the game.

The T-Birds finally got on the board on a 19-yard TD pass from senior quarterback Cody Stone to sophomore wide-out Tyson Poots. Senior kicker Steve Pulver cut the Griz lead to 39-10 on a 42-yard field goal with 9:40 to play. Mariani’s fourth touchdown grab and Selle’s fourth scoring pass, this one covering 36 yards, came with 7:09 remaining, making it the final score of 46-10.

Mariani, from Havre, had career-highs of 8 catches for 208 yards. His 208 receiving yards tied him for the sixth most in single-game history (208, Joe Douglass at Montana, 1995). His four TD receptions tied three others for the most ever scoring grabs in a contest. He had 289 all-purpose yards (208 receiving and 81 via returns).

Montana’s six touchdown passes, two by Bergquist and four by Selle, tied the school record set in 1998 at Stephen F. Austin and in 1995 at home against Boise State. UM had 10 different receivers with at least one catch.

Selle, who came in for a banged up Bergquist, was 13-of-20-0 for 204 yards and the four scores, while Bergquist, who improved to 19-4 as a starter, was 7-of-15-1 for 129 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

UM junior halfback Thomas Brooks-Fletcher had 13 carries for 61 yards, while sophomore Chase Reynolds picked up 41 yards on 13 totes. Senior halfback Andrew Schmidt had 7 carries for 21 yards and left the game with an apparent injury.

Junior defensive tackle Austin Mullins led the Griz with 10 tackles, a sack and 1 ½ stops for losses, while senior tackle Craig Mettler had 8 tackles, a sack and 1 ½ stops for losses as well. Freshman cornerback Trumaine Johnson had 2 interceptions.

For the T-Birds, Stone was 11-of-24-3 for 133 yards and a TD and was sacked five times. Poots had team-highs of 4 catches for 52 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore halfback Decker Alexander had game-highs of 26 carries for 86 yards.

MISSOULA, MT -- The fourth-ranked Montana (3-0) the homecoming win over UC Davis (1-3) 29-24 in a homecoming game played in front of a record-setting crowd (25,209) at Washington-Grizzly Stadium for the second week in a row.

The Griz have now won 16 homecoming games in a row and 24 straight regular-season games.

The Aggies took their first lead of the game with 6:36 left on the clock at 24-23, but Montana came surging back on a go-ahead on a seven-yard touchdown pass to Marc Mariani.

Montana quarterback Cole Bergquist completed 19-of-29 passes for 255 yards and two touchdowns. Mariani caught seven balls for 98 yards and a touchdown, while senior wide receiver Mike Ferriter caught four passes for 83 yards and a score.

UC Davis quarterback Greg Denham threw for 251 yards on 31-of-38 passes with one touchdown and one interception. Chris Carter led the Aggies receiving corps with seven catches for 68 yards. Running back Brandon Tucker rushed 21 times for 81 yards and one touchdown.

On third-and-long in UM's opening drive, Ferriter made a finger-tip catch for 33 yards on a pass from Bergquist. Sophomore running back Chase Reynolds capped off the drive with a four-yard score and his first career TD.

Sophomore safety Houston Stockton came up big on special teams by blocking a punt, and on UM's first play after the block Bergquist hit Ferriter for a 26-yard touchdown pass. The PAT was blocked, giving the Grizzlies an early 13-0 lead.

UC Davis' second drive was a 15-play, 53 yard drive, which ate up 8:45 on the clock, and was capped off by a 36-yard field goal by kicker Sean Kelley, making it 13-3 Griz with just over a minute left in the first quarter.

Freshman kicker Brody McKnight made his first field goal attempt as a Grizzly, a 46-yarder which extended UM's lead to 16-3.

On the Aggies' next drive Denham completed six passes to five different receivers for 65 yards, with Tucker scoring on a one-yard run, making it 16-10, UM.

On a third-and-three from Montana's 45-yard line, Denham dropped back for a pass and his throw bounced off a Grizzly player's helmet and it was picked off by cornerback Trumaine Johnson who returned it 53 yards to the Aggie 5-yard line. Griz running back Thomas Brooks-Fletcher capitalized on the turnover two plays later on a 3-yard touchdown run, giving Montana a 23-10 halftime lead.

After a scoreless third quarter, Denham scored from one yard out, bringing UC Davis to within six points at 23-17.

With 6:36 left in the game, the Aggies took their first lead of the game at 24-23 on a 7-yard touchdown pass from Denham to Bakari Grant.

Mariani and Bergquist connected three times for 48 yards on the ensuing drive, and Mariani's nine-yard TD grab gave Montana a 29-24 advantage.

The Aggies, facing a fourth-and-two from their own 40-yard line, elected to go to the air, and Denham's short pass was batted down by Grizzly linebacker Brandon Fisher and Montana took over on downs.

MISSOULA, MT – Redshirt freshman place-kicker Brody McKnight connected on a 42-yard field goal with one second left, as Montana edged the upset-minded Wildcats.

It was a battle between two unbeaten teams. The Wildcats, ranked seventh in Division II, entered the game 4-0, while the Grizzlies, ranked fourth in the Football Championship Subdivision, came in at 3-0.

The win gave Montana a 4-0 start for the second year in a row. The last Griz teams to accomplish that were the 1969 and 1970 squads.

Montana extended its school and Big Sky Conference records by winning its 25th straight regular season game. Since opening the 2006 season with a loss to Iowa, Montana has won 25 straight regular-season games (10 in 2006, 11 in 2007 and four this season). UM broke the previous mark of 23 straight regular-season victories it set from 1969-71.

For the third straight week, the Grizzlies set a Big Sky record for the largest home crowd at a non-conference game, as 25,326 packed the newly-expanded Washington-Grizzly Stadium to watch UM nip CWU. The Griz also set attendance records earlier this year against Southern Utah (25,056) and UC Davis (25,209).

Central Washington capitalized on five turnovers by Montana, but the visitors from Ellensburg, Wash., also showed a lot of grit, overcoming an 11-point deficit with 7:30 remaining.

The Wildcats cut the Grizzly lead to 35-32, when quarterback Mile Reilly hit wide-out Johnny Spevak for a 56-yard scoring pass with 7:30 to go. A pass from Reilly to tight end Jared Bronson was good for the two-point conversion.

CWU recovered the ensuing on-side kick, and six plays later kicker Garrett Rolsma's 44-yard field goal knotted the score at 35-all with 2:47 left to play.

Starting from their own 35-yard line, UM eked its way down the field, with the key plays, two catches by Mike Ferriter, covering 40 yards. McKnight then nailed the game-winner with one tick left on the clock.

Thanks to a Griz fumble, CWU took an early 7-0 lead on a 32-yard touchdown pass from Reilly to Ryan Dyer. But the Grizzlies made it 7-7 a few minutes later when Bergquist hit tight end Dan Beaudin for a 2-yard touchdown pass.

CWU took a 14-7 lead when linebacker Buddy Wood scooped up a Bergquist fumble and raced 20 yards for a score. CWU took its biggest lead, 21-7 with 8:50 to go until halftime, when Reilly and Bronson hooked up for a 17-yard scoring pass.

Montana came back with back-to-back touchdown passes from Bergquist to Marc Mariani of 64 and 42 yards, which tied the score 21-21 with 2:47 left until intermission.

Reynold's first touchdown run, a 12-yarder around left end, came at the 3:05 mark of the third quarter, and was the only scoring in that stanza, setting up the dramatic, 21-points scored in the final 15 minutes.

Bergquist was 25-of-34-1 for a career-high 377 yards and three touchdowns. Ferriter had a career-high 133 receiving yards and matched his career best with eight receptions, while Mariani had six grabs for 161 yards and two scores.

Reynolds rushed for a career-best 87 yards on 16 carries, and had the first two touchdown day in his career as well.

Senior safety Colt Anderson had a team-high 10 tackles, while junior linebacker Shawn Lebsack had eight stops and a tackle for a loss.

Reilly, from Kalispell, was 21-of-35-0 for 280 yards and three touchdowns, while Spevak had seven receptions for a game-leading 136 yards. CWU senior linebacker Chris James had a game-high 15 tackles.

At Weber State 45, Montana 28

OGDEN, UTAH – Montana’s streaks of 25 regular season wins and 16 straight Big Sky Conference victories came to a halt at Weber State, as the third-ranked Grizzlies (4-1/0-1) were unable to overcome four turnovers — two fumbles and two interceptions — and the Wildcats (4-2/2-0) had seven sacks to defeat Montana for the first time in 10 years.

With less than 12 minutes left in the game, Montana brought the game within reach at 28-38 on a five-yard touchdown catch from quarterback Cole Bergquist to wide receiver Mike Ferriter

But, Weber State put the game out of reach on the ensuing drive with 8:41 left in the game when sophomore quarterback Cameron Higgins hit Bryant Eteuati for a 28-yard TD pass.

WSU junior halfback Trevyn Smith, as the 5-9, 210-pounder rushed 22 times for 158 yards and a touchdown, and also had four catches for 54 yards and a score. Higgins threw for 237 yards on 21-of-30-1 passes, throwing touchdowns to three different receivers and one interception.

The Grizzlies took a 21-10 lead on a six-play, 52-yard scoring drive, when Cole Bergquist scored on a quarterback keeper from seven yards.

On Montana’s next drive, Bergquist’s pass was picked off by cornerback Terrell Cloud, who returned the ball to Montana’s 26-yard line.

After the fumble recovery, WSU back-up quarterback Brandon Doyle took a keeper up the middle for a 20-yard touchdown to give the Wildcats a 24-21 lead with 6:23 left in the first half, and they never trailed again.

WSU ended the first half with a Higgins to Mike Phillips eight-yard touchdown pass, and WSU led 31-21 at halftime.

The first play of the fourth quarter was disastrous for the Grizzlies when Bergquist lateraled to Klaboe who fumbled for the second time in the game.

WSU safety Scotty Goodloe picked up the fumble and returned it to Montana’s five-yard line, and two plays later, Smith ran it in from five yards out to put the Wildcats up 38-21.

Montana, down by 17 with 11:44 left in the fourth quarter, finally scored, as Bergquist’s 5-yard touchdown pass to Mike Ferriter brought the Griz to within ten points, at 38-28. That touchdown was Montana’s first and only points in the second half.

Higgins put the game out of reach for the Grizzlies when he connected with Eteuati on a 28-yard touchdown to give WSU a 45-28 lead with 8:41 left.

Bergquist completed 14-of-26 passes for 273 yards, two touchdowns, and two interceptions.

Palmer had career-highs of four catches for 115 yards and had his first career touchdown. Marc Mariani had 4 grabs for 71 yards, while Ferriter had 3 for 45 and a score.

Reynolds rushed 12 times for 40 yards and a TD, while wide receiver/halfback Rob Schulte had three carries for 32 yards.

Griz senior safety Colt Anderson had a game-high 12 tackles.

CHENEY, WASH. -- The 12th-ranked Montana Grizzlies held the potent EWU offense for the win.

EWU was within a touchdown (10-3) for more than half the game, but they couldn't find the endzone.

Montana put EWU away with 10 minutes left when Andrew Schmidt blocked an Eagle punt and Erik Stoll recovered the punt on the EWU eight-yard line. One play later, Montana quarterback Cole Bergquist hit receiver Mark Mariani for a touchdown, making it 17-3, putting the game out of reach for the Eagles.

Bergquist threw for 199 yards on 15-of-25 passes and two touchdowns. Mariani caught five balls for 118 yards and scored the only two TDs of the game. Eagle quarterback Matt Nichols went 19-for-45 for 191 yards.

On EWU's opening drive, Alexis Alexander broke free for a long run, but Griz cornerback Andrew Swink forced a fumble which was recovered by UM's Shann Schillinger in the endzone for a touchback.

Montana Severin Campbell partially blocked a punt to give the offense the ball on the Eagles 39-yard line, and on the first play Bergquist connected with a wide open Mariani for the game's first touchdown.

On EWU's fourth drive Alexander gave his offense a first-and-10 at Montana's 11-yard line after a 48-yard run, but UM's defense held, forcing EWU to kick a 24-yard field goal in the second quarter, giving them their only points of the game, making it 10-3, Montana.

The Grizzly defense held firm in the third quarter, and dominated in time of possession, 11:27 to 3:33. With 13 seconds left in the third quarter, the Eagles, on fourth-and-12, decided to go for the first down and Nichols overthrew his intended receiver, giving UM the ball on their own 43-yard line.

On fourth-and-inches on the Eastern Washington 19 yard line, Montana went for it with just under 13 minutes left in the game and Schmidt picked up the crucial first down on a three-yard run up the middle.

Early in the final quarter, the Griz defense forced EWU to punt and Schmidt came up huge on special teams with his second blocked punt of the season.

Griz senior defensive end Michael Stadnyk was sacking Nichols in the endzone when Nichols was called for intentional grounding, which resulted in a safety, giving Montana a 19-3 lead with 6:21 left in the contest.

Montana dominated the time of possession battle, 38:52 to 21:08 for the game, and a whopping 22:59 to 7:01 in the final 30 minutes.

The Griz rushed 49 times for 208 yards rushing, but ended up with 149 net yards, as Bergquist was sacked five times for a loss of 45 yards. Sophomore Chase Reynolds had 12 carries for 63 yards, Schmidt gained 39 on 12 totes, and Thomas Brooks-Fletcher picked up 34 yards on nine rushes.

MISSOULA, MT – Montana senior quarterback Cole Bergquist passed for four touchdowns, two each to junior Marc Mariani and senior Mike Ferriter, to lead the eighth-ranked Grizzlies.

A record crowd of 25,486 in Washington-Grizzly Stadium saw Montana improve to 6-1 overall and 2-1 in league, while Sac State goes to 3-4/1-3. The old Washington-Grizzly Stadium attendance record 25,326 set against Central Washington earlier this season.

Bergquist was 17-of-19-0 (89.5%) passing for 290 yards. Mariani's two TD grabs went for 24 and 46 yards, while Ferriter scoring catches covered 31 and 73 yards. Mariani caught eight balls for 131 yards, while Ferriter had five for 119 yards.

Sac State sophomore QB Jason Smith was 20-of-36-1for 185 yards and one touchdown, while Hornet senior wide receiver Tony Washington had 130 yards on 12 catches, and sophomore running back Bryan Hilliard ran 24 times for 96 yards.

Early in the first quarter connected with Mariani for a 24-yard touchdown with 9:12 left, making it 7-0 Griz.

A Sac facemask penalty gave the Griz new life, and on a third-and-goal from the two-yard line, senior halfback Andrew Schmidt scored to give Montana a 14-0.

Montana went up 16-0 when Sac State punter Oscar DeAlba couldn't grab an errant snap, which resulted in a safety.

After senior linebacker Tyler Corwin had his first career interception, it led to a Bergquist to Ferriter 31-yard scoring pass, making it 23-0 UM with 5:19 left until half.

Sac State came alive on the next drive when Smith connected with Washington on a deep 46-yard pass. A few plays later, Smith threw the ball into the left corner of the end zone and receiver Kyle Hill caught the 19-yard pass from Smith for the Hornet's first and only touchdown of the contest, making it 23-7 Montana with 2:51 left in the second quarter.

Montana scored again on a quarterback draw by Bergquist from 14 yards out to give the Grizzlies a 29-7 lead at halftime.

Bergquist and Mariani hooked up again with 12:44 remaining in the third quarter when Mariani caught a short pass in the left flat and broke several tackles to score from 46 yards out, giving the Griz a 36-7 lead.

The Grizzlies first play on their next drive resulted in another touchdown when Bergquist hit Ferriter on a 73-yard touchdown bomb down the right sideline, giving the Grizzlies a commanding and final 43-7 lead with 6:37 left in the third quarter.

Montana's defense held Sac State to 250 total yards, including 65 rush yards on 32 carries. The Griz had 439 total yards, 314 passing and 125 rushing.

Bergquist moved up to fourth in career touchdown passes with 47, and he moved up to seventh in career passing yards with 6,035.

Mariani now has 11 receiving touchdowns this season, which ranks him fifth in single-season history.

Ferriter moved up to 16th in career receiving yards with 1,744, while his 124 receptions are the 17th most in school history.

GREELEY, COLO.—Sophomore halfback Chase Reynolds rushed for a career-high 137 yards and two touchdowns, and senior quarterback Cole Bergquist passed for 243 yards and two scores, as the eighth-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies won their seventh game of the season – guaranteeing them their 23rd winning season in a row.

Montana took a three touchdown lead at the end of the first half on an eight-play, 93-yard drive, when Bergquist scored on a quarterback keeper on a six-yard touchdown run, making it 24-3 Montana at halftime.

Bergquist completed 78 percent of his passes, going 14-of-18-0 in three quarters of action.

Griz wide receivers Mike Ferriter and Marc Mariani again had impressive outings. Ferriter had three receptions for 88 yards and one touchdown, while Mariani caught two balls for 38 yards and one touchdown.

Reynolds had just 14 carries, and scoring runs of 43 and 32 yards.

Northern Colorado was forced to play all three of its quarterbacks after junior starter, Bryan Waggener did not return in the second half after an undisclosed injury. Waggener was 6-of-11 for 53 yards, while redshirt freshman quarterback Dylan Orms was 6-of-11 for one touchdown and 53 yards, and had a team-high 67 yards rushing and a touchdown. Sophomore QB James Schrenk saw limited action.

On the first Griz drive Reynolds had nine carries for 44 yards to get the Grizzlies within field goal range, and freshman kicker Brody McKnight put UM ahead 3-0 on a 20-yard field goal.

On their next drive, the Bears found themselves with a first-and-goal after a couple of long plays, but it stalled, and kicker Michael York tied the game three-all on a 27 yard field goal with 30 seconds left in the first quarter.

Montana kept giving the ball to Reynolds and when he took an inside draw through the line, he cut back to the right across the field and raced to the end zone on the 43-yard touchdown, giving UM a 10-3 lead.

On the next Griz possession Bergquist hit Ferriter on a deep crossing route, and he cut down the right sideline and out-sprinted several UNC defenders for the 75-yard touchdown. The four-play, 94-yard drive gave Montana a 17-3 lead.

UM got the ball back with 1:39 left on the clock, and on an eight-play, 93-yard drive, culminated with a keeper by Bergquist, as he ran up the middle for a six-yard touchdown to give Montana a 24-3 halftime lead.

The Grizzlies started the second half the same way they ended the first, as Reynolds went untouched on a 32-yard touchdown run to extend Montana's lead to 31-3 to start the second half.

After a UNC field goal the Griz scored again, this time Bergquist connected with Mariani who scored on a 30-yard touchdown – his 12th TD reception of the season, giving the Griz a 38-6 lead with 3:32 left in the third quarter. McKnight added UM's final points on a 30-yard field goal with 13 seconds left in the third quarter, pushing the Griz advantage to 41-3.

UNC scored two TDs in the final minutes of the contest, the first a one-yard run by Orms, and the next an Orms pass to Brandon Smith for a five-yard TD.

Griz junior tight end Steve Pfahler had a career and game-high four catches for 55 yards, while senior receiver Rob Schulte and Reynolds each had two catches.

Senior strong safety Colt Anderson and senior linebacker Tyler Corwin each had a team-leading nine tackles, while sophomore end Ryan Fetherston had seven stops and two tackles for loss.

MISSOULA, MONTANA – Sophomore halfback Chase Reynolds rushed for a career-high 157 yards and three touchdowns and senior quarterback Cole Bergquist passed for three scores, as the sixth-ranked Grizzlies defeated the 19th-ranked Lumberjacks.

The improved to 8-1 overall and 4-1 in league, while the Lumberjacks went to 6-3/4-2.

The victory was a milestone for six-year Griz head coach Bobby Hauck, as it was the 60th of his career.

Montana rushed for a season-high 223 yards against a team that started the game ranked first in the Football Championship Subdivision in rush defense, giving up just 18.8 yards per contest. NAU had allowed just 150 total net rush yards in its first eight games this season until the Griz erupted for 223 yards and averaged a season-high 5.4 yards on their 41 carries.

Reynolds rushed 12 times for his 157 yards to average 13.1 yards per tote, and scored on runs of 6, 37, and a career-best 67 yards.

Bergquist, a senior from San Clemente, Calif., was 14-of-23-0 for 186 yards and had touchdown throws of 11, 9, and 5 yards.

Senior wide receiver Mike Ferriter was on the receiving end of two of Bergquist's scoring passes and he had a team-high four grabs for 56 yards.

Junior wide-out Marc Mariani scored on an 11-yard pass from Bergquist, and had three receptions for 60 yards. Mariani now has 13 touchdown catches this season, which ties him for the third most in single season history with Marvin Turk (1991) and Mike Rice (1986).

On its first possession, Montana set the tone for the game, marching 80 yards on 13 plays, using up 6:23 on the clock, Reynolds scoring on a six-yard run to give the Griz an early 7-0 lead.

The floodgates then opened, as the Grizzlies capitalized on four first-half turnovers by NAU, two via interceptions and two via fumble recoveries. Those four Lumberjack miscues led to 24 unanswered points, and Montana took a commanding 31-0 lead at halftime.

Montana's defense was once again solid in the third quarter. Reynolds broke loose for his 67-yard scoring scamper, although NAU did get on the board on a 24-yard field goal by senior kicker Robbie Dehaze, which made it 38-3 after three stanzas. The Grizzlies have now out-scored their opponents 61-6 in the third quarter this season.

The Griz "D" held NAU to 264 total yards, 151 rushing and 113 passing. Montana gained 436 total yards, the 223 on the ground and 213 via the airways.

UM senior safety Colt Anderson had two picks, seven tackles, two PBs, and a tackle for loss. Senior linebacker Tyler Corwin had a team-best eight stops, a sack, and a fumble recovery, while senior end Mike Stadyk added seven tackles, a sack, and a forced fumble.

NAU freshman running back Deonte Williams had 15 carries for 105 yards and had his team's only touchdown, scoring on an 11-yard run with 7:32 left in the game. Jack senior quarterback Lance Kriesien was 14-of-22-1 for 83 yards and had minus-one yards rushing.

PORTLAND, OREGON – The fifth-ranked Montana

Grizzlies were led by sophomore halfback Chase

Reynolds' three touchdowns runs; senior quarterback Cole Bergquist added 91 rushing yards and a touchdown; and UM's defense limited the Vikings 210 total yards to lead the way.

The Vikings were moving the ball on their first drive of the second half, but that came to a halt when Griz senior safety Colt Anderson recovered a Mario D'Ambrosio fumble after a long reception. Reynolds, who had career-highs of 35 carries for 160 yards and the three touchdowns, made the most of the turnover by scoring from 18 yards out. The seven-play, 52-yard drive put the Griz up 16-5 with 8:18 left in the third quarter.

The Vikings bounced right back, though, on just three plays and 72 yards when sophomore quarterback Drew Hubel hit Raymond Fry on a 38 yard touchdown pass to bring the Vikings back within four points (16-12).

On the Grizzlies' next possession it appeared as though Bergquist had completed a pass to senior wide receiver Mike Ferriter, but the initial call from the line judge was overruled by the field judge. Montana's bench disputed the call and was called for an unsportsman-like penalty, which turned a 20-plus yard pass completion into a 15-yard penalty. The Grizzlies were able to overcome the penalty and set up to attempt a 44-yard field goal, but kicker Brody McKnight faked the kick and took the pitch from holder Jeff Larson and ran for the first down. PSU held the Griz on downs, but Montana went for it on fourth down from the PSU 11-yard line, and Reynolds scored his first TD of the game with 31 seconds remaining in the third quarter to increase Montana's lead to 23-12.

Hubel, after completing a 47-yard pass to Lavonte Kirven, was picked off near the goal line by junior linebacker Brandon Fisher with a little more than nine minutes remaining in the game. PSU forced Montana to punt, though, and Hubel was again intercepted by Fisher on the first play of the ensuing drive. Reynolds once again made the most of the turnover by scoring on a 21-yard run, which gave the Grizzlies a comfortable 29-12 lead with 3:51 left to play – the final points of the contest.

Both teams had come into this game with potent offenses, but it was a defensive first half as the Griz held the Vikings to just 50 total yards, while PSU gave up 153 total yards. Even though Montana dominated the time of possession (19 to 11) in the first half, the Griz had just nine points to show for it, as it was 9-5 at intermission.

The 91 yards rushing on 16 carries by Bergquist was a career-best, bettering the 89 yards he gained against Albany last season. In UM's last three games Reynolds has rushed for 137 yards at Northern Colorado, 157 against Northern Arizona, and the 160 at PSU, giving him 454 yards and eight touchdowns in his last three games.

Junior wide receiver Marc Mariani had a game-high five catches for 38 yards, but did not have at least one touchdown reception in a game for only the third time this season. Reynolds also had four grabs for 19 yards, while Ferriter had three for 29.

Griz defensive ends Jace Palmer and Mike Stadnyk had two sacks each, while senior safety Colt Anderson had a team-best six tackles and a fumble recovery, and Fisher had two picks.

Montana dominated the game statistically. The Griz out-gained the Vikings 427 to 210 in total yards, and double PSU in first downs (24 to 12). UM's ground game racked up season-highs of 309 yards on 62 attempts, which accounted for the lop-sided time of possession numbers (43:21 to 16:39 for the Grizzlies).

The win improved Montana's record to 100-21 this decade, and those 100 victories are the most by any FBS or FCS team during that time span. Oklahoma has the second most wins at 98-18, while Appalachian State is the closest FCS team in number of wins in the decades, ranked eighth with a mark of 87-29.

It was also “Senior Day” for 18 Griz players, as Montana has now won 10 or more games for the 14th time in school history, and the third season in a row. Griz head coach Bobby Hauck improved his career mark to 62-15, and won 10 or more games for the fourth time in his six-year tenure.

The Grizzlies improved to 10-1 overall and 6-1 in the Big Sky Conference and won their sixth straight game. The Bengals fall to 0-11 and 0-7, losing their 15th game in a row, dating back to last season.

Most of the scoring came in the second quarter. The Grizzlies took a 2-0 lead in the opening stanza when UM senior defensive tackle Craig Mettler tackled junior halfback Clint Knickrehm in the send zone for a safety, and that proved to be the only points scored in the opening quarter.

ISU took a 7-2 lead when junior quarterback Kyle Blum, in his first ever start, hit senior receiver Eddie Thompson for a 43-yard touchdown at the 13:48 mark of the second quarter. The Bengals score was set up when Griz quarterback Cole Bergquist was picked off by senior cornerback D.J. Clark, giving ISU the ball on its own 38-yard line. Bergquist had thrown 117 consecutive passes until Clark’s pick.

Montana bounced back though, scoring 20 unanswered points to take a 22-7 lead at halftime. Junior Marc Mariani electrified the crowd of 23,527 (19th highest attendance in WGS in 166 games), taking a punt return 94 yards for a touchdown, tying the Big Sky record held by two others, one of whom is former Griz standout Tuff Harris who scored on a 94-yarder at Eastern Washington in 2006. Mariani’s TD run gave UM a 15-7 lead with 5:14 to go until intermission.

UM’s other two scores in the quarter came on a 7-yard touchdown run by Bergquist, and an 8-yard scoring pass from Bergquist to junior wide receiver Tyler Palmer.

The teams’ defenses dominated the second half, ISU scoring on a 27-yard field goal by Mike Ramos in the third quarter, and Reynold scoring the game’s final points on a one-yard dive into the endzone with 9:45 left to play.

Reynolds, who rushed 18 times for his 153 yards, carried the ball 13 times for 123 yards in the second half. Reynolds has rushed for 607 yards and nine touchdowns in Montana’s last four games.

Bergquist was 10-of-21-1 for 77 yards. Senior receiver Mike Ferriter had a team-high three catches for 21 yards and also completed his first-ever pass, a 20-yarder to Bergquist. Senior running back Andrew Schmidt added 10 carries for 46 yards.

The Griz defense tied their season-high with six sacks (UM also had six sacks against Southern Utah), and senior end Mike Stadnyk had a team-high two sacks. Junior free safety Shann Schillinger led the Griz with a team-high 9 tackles, and he also had two interceptions, and he had another pick nullified due to a penalty. Mettler had two tackles for loss, two pass deflections, a fumble recovery, a sack, and tackle in the end zone for a safety. Junior end George Mercer had a sack and the forced fumble that led to Mettler’s fumble recovery.

Blum was 16-of-34-3 for 246 yards and a TD, while Thompson had game-highs of 8 catches for 120 yards and a TD.

MISSOULA, MT – The fifth-ranked Grizzlies overcame an early deficit to defeat the 23rd-ranked Bobcats in a first-round Football Championship Subdivision playoff game.

It was a tale of two halves, as the Grizzlies outscored the Bobcats 24-3 in the second half after being down 10-0 in the first quarter and trailing 10-7 at halftime.

The Griz (12-1) were able to take control because of the play of sophomore running back Chase Reynolds, who had career-highs of 38 carries and 233 yards, and scored two touchdowns.

TXST (8-5) struck first, as senior kicker Andrew Ireland hit a 47-yard field goal to give the Bobcats an early 3-0 lead.

On its third possession of the game, Texas State junior quarterback Bradley George connected with wide receiver Cameron Luke in the left corner of the end zone for a touchdown, extending Texas State's lead to 10-0 with 4:33 left in the first quarter.

Montana got the ball with 1:09 left in the first half, and Griz senior quarterback Cole Bergquist connected with junior wide receiver Marc Mariani for a 14-yard TD pass, which brought the Griz within three points (10-7) with 16 seconds left until halftime.

Montana's offense put together a six-play, 71-yard drive on its opening drive of the second half, and when Bergquist scrambled to his left and broke a couple of tackles, he scored from 21 yards out, giving the Grizzlies a 14-10 lead with 11:47 left in the third quarter, and Montana led the rest of the way.

The Griz extended the lead to 21-10 when Reynolds scored on a 4-yard run at the 5:14 mark of the third quarter.

The Bobcats bounced right back, though, as George completed a 48-yard pass to freshman wide receiver Daren Dillard who was tackled on Montana's six yard line. But the Griz defense held, and Texas State had to settle for a 25-yard field goal by Ireland, making it 21-13 with 3:22 to go in the third quarter.

When Reynolds left into the endzone for a 1-yard touchdown run, UM took a 28-13 lead with 12:50 left in the game. Montana made it a three-score game at 31-13 when kicker Brody McKnight made a 37-yard field goal with 2:49 left in the contest.

Reynolds' 233 yards rushing is the third most in single-season history (since 1968), while his 38 carries tied the school mark. He has now rushed for 17 touchdowns this season, which ties the school record. Reynolds has 1,228 rushing yards this year, which is the fifth most ever in a season.

Bergquist was 13-of-23-2 for 177 yards, threw for one touchdown, and rushed for another. Bergquist now has 6,882 career passing yards, which moves him up to fourth all-time, while his 55 career touchdown throws ties him with Grady Bennett (55, 1988-90) for the third most in school history. He is now 29-5 as a starter, tying him for the second most wins ever by a Griz quarterback (29 wins, Brian Ay Yat, 1995-98).

Mariani led UM with four catches for 49 yards and a TD, while senior wide-out Mike Ferriter added three grabs for 64 yards.

Ferriter now has 2,056 career receiving yards, making him the 11th player in school history to have more than 2,000 career receiving yards. Mariani has 15 touchdown receptions this season, the second most in school history, while his 1,058 receiving yards in 2008 are the fifth most in single-season history.

Griz junior free safety Shann Schillinger had a team-high 11 tackles, while senior strong safety Colt Anderson had nine stops, three tackles for loss, and a forced fumble. Anderson now has 278 career tackles, which moves him up to 11th on UM's career tackles list.

At Montana 24, Weber State 13

MISSOULA, MT -- Halfback Chase Reynolds rushed for 185 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Grizzlies.

Fifth-ranked Montana jumped to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter thanks to a pair of turnovers by 10th-ranked Weber State.

The Griz scored first when senior quarterback Cole Bergquist broke loose for a 35-yard touchdown run with 9:41 to go in the first quarter, giving UM a 7-0 lead. The Griz started the drive on their own 45-yard line after senior defensive tackle Craig Mettler recovered a fumble by WSU sophomore quarterback Cameron Higgins.

The Grizzlies took advantage of WSU's second turnover, as Reynolds scored on a one-yard run with 27 seconds left in the opening stanza. WSU was moving the ball, but junior tight end Cody Nakamura fumbled after making a catch, and it was recovered by Griz junior free safety Shann Schillinger and UM took over on its own 24-yard line.

WSU got on the board with 9:24 remaining until halftime, as workhorse halfback Trevyn Smith powered his way into the endzone on a two-yard scoring run. Montana led 14-7 at half.

The Grizzlies extended their lead in the third quarter on a 38-yard field goal by freshman kicker Brody McKnight with 8:30 left in the third quarter, giving UM a 17-7 lead.

However, the Wildcats countered with a three-pointer of their own, as sophomore Jon Williams hit a 32-yard field goal, cutting the Montana lead to 17-10 with 45 ticks left in the quarter. Williams connected on a 22-yard field goal with 9:17 left in the game, cutting the Montana lead to 17-13.

After the second WSU field goal Reynolds and the Grizzly offense marched 74 yards on 10 plays and used more than five minutes (5:07) off the clock, as Reynolds broke around left end for a 12-yard touchdown run, and Montana led 24-13 with 4:02 to go. In that scoring drive Reynolds had seven carries for 34 yards, culminating with his 12-yard touchdown.

On their next and final possession the Wildcats advanced the ball to the UM 37-yard line, but the Griz defense held, and Reynolds rushed five times for 38 yards and a pair of first downs to ice the game for Montana.

Reynolds had 33 carries for his 185 yards, and 23 totes for 129 yards in the second half. Bergquist rushed 10 times for 68 yards, while senior halfback Andrew Schmidt had seven carries for 61 yards.

On the season, Reynolds has rushed for 1,413 yards and a school-record 19 touchdowns. His 1,413 yards rushing are the second most in a season.

Bergquist was 8-of-19-0 for 113 yards passing, while Griz wide receivers Tyler Palmer, Marc Mariani, and Mike Ferriter had two catches each. Ferriter now has 144 receptions, which ties him with Mike Erhardt (1993-96) for 12th on the career list.

Bergquist has 2,747 passing yards this year, which are the 13th most in a season. His 7,096 career yards rank him fourth in school history, and his 55 career TD throws ties him with Grady Bennett (1988-90) for the third most.

Montana safety Colt Anderson and junior linebacker Shawn Lebsock each had a team-leading nine tackles, and Anderson also had an interception. Junior free safety Schann Schillinger had seven tackles, a tackle for a loss, and fumble recovery.

Anderson now has 287 career tackles, tying him for the ninth most in school history.

Smith rushed 19 times for 104 yards and a touchdown. Higgins was 19-of-40-1 for 270 yards. It was WSU's lowest point total of the season. Senior linebackers J.D. Folsom and Biff Swan led the Wildcats with a game-high 12 tackles apiece.

Montana 35, at James Madison 27

HARRISONBURG, VA -Griz running back Chase Reynolds ran for 123 yards and two touchdowns and also scored on a reception, senior quarterback Cole Bergquist passed for 142 yards and three touchdowns, while Montana's defense created four turnovers.

On their first drive they ran the ball nine out of 10 plays to the Griz 15-yard line, but Montana's defense held and forced the Dukes to kick a 32-yard field goal, giving JMU an early 3-0 lead.

Montana, on their first drive, was faced with a third-and-10 on JMU's 49-yard line, and Bergquist snuck out of the pocket and picked up 13 yards to keep the drive alive. On the next play, Reynolds followed his fullback through the line and picked up 35 yards before being tackled at the two-yard line. Three plays later on third-and-goal at the two, Reynolds powered his way into the end zone, and the Griz took a 7-3 lead with 4:59 left in the opening quarter.

On the following kickoff, special teamer Caleb McSurdy forced Dukes' returner Scotty McGee to fumble and fellow freshman Donny Lisowski recovered the ball at James Madison's 15-yard line. It took Montana just two plays to punch it in for their second touchdown, Reynolds scoring on a seven-yard run which put the Griz up 14-3 with 4:02 to go in the first quarter.

JMU running back Eugene Holloman cut the Grizzly lead to 14-10 with 11:54 on a 1-yard run to go in the second quarter, and Montana led by that score at halftime.

The Griz got excellent field position at their 48-yard-line to start the second half, when Marc Mariani returned the kickoff to his 48-yard line. On a second-and-three from JMU's 27-yard line, Bergquist faked a handoff and threw to a streaking Reynolds who scored on a 27-yard reception, putting the Griz up 21-10 with 11:06 in the third quarter.

On the ensuing kickoff, freshman defensive end Ryan Fetherston stripped Dukes' returner Patrick Ward and recovered the fumble at JMU's 34-yard line, and five plays later Bergquist found junior tight end Steve Pfahler for the 16-yard touchdown catch, and Montana took a 28-10 lead at the 8:14 mark of the third quarter.

James Madison was not going to go away, though. On third-and-5, backup quarterback Drew Dudzik ran a quarterback keeper for a 10-yard touchdown run to make it 28-17 with 5:02 left in the third quarter.

Montana answered the JMU score, though, as Bergquist had a 32-yard run to the JMU's nine-yard line, and then three plays later he hit Mike Ferriter on a 9-yard touchdown pass and UM took a 35-17 lead with just over a minute to go in the third.

James Madison scored with 6:10 remaining in the game when Dudzik scored from 18 yards out on a quarterback draw. JMU elected to go for the two-point conversion and got it when Dudzik jumped for the end zone, with instant replay ruling the ball just over the goal line, to bring the Dukes within eight points (35-27).

James Madison got the ball back with 2:06 on its own 7-yard line and moved the ball to their own 41, but the Griz held them off and then ran the game clock out to punch their ticket to Chattanooga.

Bergquist was 11-of-17-0 and completed 9-of-10 passes in the second half. He also rushed five times for 42 yards.

Reynolds and Mariani each had 3 catches for 50 yards, while Pfahler had 3 for 29, and Ferriter had 2 for 13 yards. Reynolds and Pfahler had their first career touchdown catches.

Reynolds' three touchdowns gives him a school-record 132 points this season, as he broke the record of former kicker Chris Snyder, who scored 124 points in 2003.

Griz senior strong safety Colt Anderson had a career-high 18 tackles, while junior free safety Shann Schillinger had 12 stops, and junior linebacker Brandon Fisher added 10.

Dudzik — replacing JMU's star quarterback Rodney Landers, who was knocked out with an injury in the first half — ran 12 times for 88 yards and two touchdowns. JMU rushed 58 times for 334 yards and three scores. Holloman added 105 rushing yards and one touchdown.

Richmond 24, Montana 7

CHATTANOOGA, TENN. – The University of Montana Grizzlies could not overcome a three-touchdown first-half deficit to the University of Richmond Spiders in the Football Championship Subdivision championship game, Richmond winning 24-7 in a game played in front of a national audience on *ESPN2* in Finley Stadium/Davenport Field.

For the Spiders, it was their first national championship in any team sport.

Senior Griz quarterback Cole Bergquist was 19-of-36 for 267 yards and one interception. He connected with junior wide receiver Marc Mariani seven times for 172 yards. Sophomore running back Chase Reynolds ran 12 times for 47 yards and Montana's only touchdown.

Bergquist was pressured all night by Richmond senior defensive end Lawrence Sidbury, Jr., who had three sacks. Spider senior quarterback Eric Ward completed 12 of his 18 passes while throwing for one touchdown and caught another touchdown. Senior running back Josh Vaughan rushed 23 times for 162 yards and one touchdown.

Richmond struck first, when on a third- and-4 Ward pitched to fullback John Crone and Crone then passed across the field back to a wide-open Ward for a 23-yard touchdown pass and catch at the nine-minute mark of the first quarter.

After Mariani laid out for a fingertip catch that went for 47 yards, Montana faced a fourth-and-1 from Richmond's 21-yard line. The Grizzlies went for the first down, and got it on a 4-yard run by Reynolds. However, the Griz drive was hampered by a penalty, and UM was forced to try a field goal after Bergquist was sacked by Sidbury, and freshman kicker Brody McKnight's 33-yard attempt was wide right.

With 11:29 remaining in the second quarter, Vaughan bounced to the outside and scored from five yards out to give Richmond the 14-0 lead. When Ward connected with freshman running back Garrett Wilkins for a 13-yard touchdown, the Spiders took a commanding 21-0 lead with 2:13 remaining in the first half.

After missing an offensive possession due to an injury, Bergquist returned to action, and on third-and-10 from their 48-yard line, he connected with Mariani for a 22-yard pass and a first down. Reynolds broke Montana's scoring drought and made it a 21-7 game when he scored from four yards out with 11:56 to go in the game.

The final points came on a 39-yard field goal by Richmond kicker Brian Radford, making 24-7 with 6:54 left to play.

Montana had 306 total yards, compared to Richmond's 327, but the Grizzlies had just 39 net yards rushing (the Spiders had 208), as Bergquist was sacked seven times. The Spiders had one more first down (16 to 15) than the Grizzlies.

Griz junior linebacker Shawn Lebsack had a game-high 13 tackles and a tackle for loss, while senior strong safety Colt Anderson had eight stops and a sack, and senior linebacker Tyler Corwin added seven tackles.
