



## 2009 GRIZ FOOTBALL: Game #11: #1 Griz vs. #23 Cats Meet for 109th time

**THE GAME:** The top-ranked (*FCS Coaches' Poll*) **University of Montana Grizzlies** (10-0/7-0 Big Sky Conference) play their final regular-season game of the year against the 23rd-ranked **Montana State Bobcats** (7-3/5-2) in the 109th Griz-Cat football contest, Saturday, Nov. 21st. Kickoff is at 12:05 p.m. (Mtn.) in MSU's Bobcat Stadium (13,500, Field Turf).

**GRIZ LAST GAME: At Montana 31, Northern Colorado 10:** Junior running back **Chase Reynolds** rushed for 151 yards and three touchdowns to lead Griz to an out-right Big Sky Conference regular-season championship.

The Grizzlies overcame an early 7-0 deficit, and took a 14-7 halftime lead when quarterback **Justin Roper** hit wide receiver **Tyler Palmer** on a 19-yard touchdown pass with 28 seconds to go until intermission. Montana outscored UNC 24-3 in the final half, thanks in large part to touchdown runs of 54 and 37 yards by **Reynolds**.

**Roper** was 13-of-20-0 for 123 yards and a touchdown, while QB **Andrew Selle** was 6-of-9-1 for 72 yards and a score. Wide receiver **Marc Mariani** had three grabs for 49 yards and a TD, while **Palmer** had three catches for 43 yards and a touchdown. Nine different players caught passes for Montana. Linebacker **Shawn Lebsock** had a team-high nine tackles, while safety **Erik Stoll** added eight stops. End **Severin Campbell** had four tackles, including two sacks, a forced fumble, a PD, and two quarterback hurries.

**CHASE HITS 1,000 AGAIN: Reynolds** now has 1,096 yards rushing for 15 touchdowns this season. It is the 10<sup>th</sup> time a UM player has rushed 1,000 or more yards in a season. It is the third time a UM player has rushed for more than 1,000 yards twice. He joins Yohance Humphery (1,658 yards in 2001 and 1,277 yards in 1999) and Lex Hilliard (1,322 yards in 2005 and 1,132 yards in 2007) to accomplish that feat. **Reynolds**, who rushed for 1,583 yards last season, is the first Griz player to exceed 1,000 rushing yards in consecutive seasons.

**12<sup>TH</sup> IN A ROW:** It is the 12<sup>th</sup> straight Big Sky championship for the Grizzlies. Montana has gone 30-1 in conference games the last four seasons and won 42 of its last 43 regular-season games.

**TEAM OF THE DECADE:** Montana now has 115 victories since the start of the 2000 season and will finish the decade with the most wins of any Division I team. Appalachian State is the closest pursuer at the FCS level with 97 victories and can finish with no more than 104 wins. Oklahoma, Boise State and Texas all have 108 victories.

**DOUBLE-DIGIT "W'S":** Montana has won 10 or more games five times in the past six years.

**24 STRAIGHT WINNING SEASONS:** Montana's victory over Eastern Washington on Oct. 17th gave the Grizzlies their 24<sup>th</sup> winning season in a row, starting in 1986.

**CATS LAST WEEK: at Montana State 27, Sac State 17:** The Cats held the Hornets to 312 total yards and picked off three passes en route to the win. Junior QB Cody Kempt was 20-of-29-0 for 222 yards and two TDs. Senior defensive end Dane Fletcher had 11 tackles, four stops for losses and 2.5 sacks.

**THE GRIZ-CAT SERIES:** Montana leads 68-35-5. The Grizzlies have won 20 of the last 23 meetings. **NOTE:** The series year-by-year scores are located on add 22 of this release.

**RADIO/TV:** UM's flagship stations are KGVO Radio (1290-AM) and KVWE Radio (101.5 FM). **Mick Holien** calls the play-by-play, **Scott Gurnsey** provides color, and **Greg Sundberg** works the sidelines. The game will be televised live on KPAX-TV of Missoula and its affiliate stations in Montana. KPAX-TV's sports director **Phil Buck** will call the action; former Griz quarterback **Grady Bennett** and former Cat linebacker **Mike Callahan** provide in-booth color; and KPAX's **Derek Buerkle** is on the sidelines.

**GRIZ TRAVEL PLANS:** The team will depart for Livingston via Beach Bus on Friday, Nov. 20, with ETA around TBD. Lodging is the Yellowstone Inn and Conference Center (406-222-6110) in Livingston. The team will depart for Missoula ASAP after the game.

**Montana Head Coach Bobby Hauck  
(Seventh Year at Montana: 76-16 overall/46-6 Big Sky)**

Bobby Hauck is the winningest coach in Big Sky Conference history in terms of victories per season (11) and conference championships (seven).

Hauck (Montana, 1988), 44, is ranked fourth in Big Sky history with his 76 career victories. Those 76 wins are the second most in school history (Don Read won 85 games in his 10-year tenure from 1986-1995).

Hauck's Griz teams have won seven straight league titles, and participated in the FCS playoffs six years in a row, and he is the only mentor at UM to accomplish that. His seven-league titles are twice as many as any other Grizzly football coach.

Montana's 75 wins the past six-plus seasons since Hauck took over the reigns in 2003 -- the most by any FCS team.

Over the past three-plus seasons Hauck's (pronounced: howk) teams are 30-1 (.968) in the Big Sky games.

He was voted the Big Sky and Region 5 "Coach of the Year" in 2006 and 2007.

Over the past six seasons the Grizzlies have had 20 players named to FCS All-American teams.

Bobby is married to the former Stacey Harbin from St. Ignatius, Mont., and the couple have twin daughters, Sydney and Alexandra, 13, a son, Robby, 11, and a daughter Elise, 2. Bobby is an avid fly-fisherman and skier.

## At Montana 35, Montana State 3

**MISSOULA, MONTANA** – The fifth-ranked Grizzlies donned their “old” copper color jerseys, last worn in 1995, and won their 11th Big Sky Conference championship in a row, defeating the Montana State Bobcats 35-3 in front of a record-setting crowd of 25,629 in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

Montana improved to 11-1 overall and 7-1 in conference, while MSU ended its season at 7-5/5-3. The Grizzlies tied Weber State (7-1) for the Big Sky title, as the Wildcats were upset 33-26 by visiting Eastern Washington.

It is the 11th time in Montana's 111 years of playing football that a Grizzly team has won 11 or more games, and the fourth time in the last five seasons (2004, 2006, 2007, 2008).

Both defenses played well in this, the 108<sup>th</sup> Griz-Cat meeting on the gridiron. Montana dominated the second half, shutting out MSU and allowing just 101 total yards (the Griz had 209 total yards) in the final two quarters.

The Grizzlies scored three unanswered offensive touchdowns in the second half, the first coming with 2:51 left in the third quarter on a 37-yard pass from quarterback Cole Bergquist to wide receiver Marc Mariani, which made the score 21-3 Montana.

Sophomore Chase Reynolds gave the Grizzlies a 28-3 bulge on his second scoring run of the contest, a 15-yarder, coming at the 4:51 mark of the fourth quarter.

Junior defensive end George Mercer put the icing on the cake for the Griz when he picked off MSU quarterback Mark Desin and returned the interception 73 yards for a touchdown with 12 seconds left in the game.

The Grizzlies capitalized on three first-half MSU fumbles to take a 14-3 lead at intermission.

Mariani got the Griz on the board first, breaking free for a 75-yard touchdown on a punt return, giving UM a 7-0 lead with 6:15 to go in the opening quarter.

Last week Mariani tied a Big Sky record with a 94-yard punt return for a score in a 29-10 home win over Idaho State.

The Cats got their only score of the game in the first quarter on a 25-yard field goal by freshman kicker Jason Cunningham, making it 7-3 UM with 2:24 in the first stanza.

Montana took a 14-3 lead when Reynolds scored on a 6-yard run with 4:04 to go until intermission. Reynolds rushed 27 times for 115 yards and two touchdowns. He has rushed for 995 yards this season, ranking him ninth in school history, while his 15 TD runs this year are the third most ever. Reynolds has rushed for 100 or more yards in Montana's last five games.

Bergquist was 11-of-22-0 for 156 yards and a touchdown. Bergquist now has 6,705 career passing yards, edging by John Edwards (6,704, 1999-2002) for the fifth most in school history.

Griz senior receiver Rob Schulte had 3 catches for 30 yards, while senior wide-out Mike Ferriter had 2 for 54, and Mariani had 2 for 41 and a score. Mariani now has 14 touchdown catches, tying him for the second most ever in a season (14, Etu Molden, 2001).

Griz senior linebacker Tyler Corwin had a team-high 11 tackles, while junior free safety Shann Schillinger added 8 stops, a tackle for a loss, and picked off his fourth pass of the year.

MSU senior running back Demetrius Crawford rushed for 203 yards, the most by any Griz opponent this season. Desin was 7-of-20-2 for 81 yards. Senior linebacker Bobby Daly led the Cats with a game-high 13 tackles.

**MISSOULA, MONTANA** – The Grizzlies got off to a slow start, but turned on the after-burners in the second half to register a 38-0 opening-season victory over the visiting Mountaineers in front of a record Washington-Grizzly Stadium crowd of 25,698.

The Griz defense was a key in the victory, holding the Mountaineers (0-2) to 116 total yards and six first downs. Montana is now 33-14 in season openers since it became an inaugural member of the the Big Sky Conference in 1963.

"It's good to be 1-0," said seventh-year UM head coach Bobby Hauck, who improved his overall record to 67-16/6-1 in season openers. "We took care of business. We didn't change anything at halftime, we just played a lot better in the second half."

The third-ranked Grizzlies (1-0) dominated the Mountaineers statistically in the first half, out-gaining them in total yards (233 to 54) and first downs (11-3), but led just 10-0. Sophomore Brody McKnight's 31-yard field goal and a 5-yard run by junior halfback Chase Reynolds, a 2009 Walter Payton Award candidate, accounted for UM's first-half scoring.

Montana came on strong in the third quarter, as tight end Steve Pfahler was on the receiving end of two touchdown throws, the first a 7-yarder from Andrew Selle, and the second a 10-yarder from Justin Roper. Pfahler's second scoring grab gave the Griz a 24-0 lead with 44 seconds left in the third stanza.

The Griz scored two unanswered touchdowns in the final quarter. After redshirt freshman wide receiver Sam Gratton blocked a WSC punt, the Griz took over on the Mountaineers' 13-yard line, and eventually scored on a 9-yard run by "true" freshman halfback Pete Nguyen. The final UM score came on a 1-yard run by halfback Dan Moore with 1:19 left.

Selle and Roper, both juniors, split playing time. Selle was 6-of-15-1 passing for 112 yards and a touchdown, while Roper was 16-of-24-0 for a 149 yards and one score.

"I think our offense started to get more efficient in the second half," said Roper. "I think we both (Selle and him) started to feel more confident and started to play with more consistency."

Reynolds rushed 18 times for 100 yards, the ninth time in his career he has hit the century mark. Nguyen had seven totes for 31 yards.

Reynolds now has 23 career rushing touchdowns, which ranks him fourth in school history. He was tied with Justin Green (2003-04) and Jody Farmer (1986-89), who rushed for 22 TDs each in their careers.

With his 100 yards rushing today, Reynolds now had 1,683 in his career, which moves him up to 10th past former Griz great Dick Imer, who gained 1,592 yards in 1953-54.

Senior wide receiver Tyler Palmer had a career-high six receptions for a game-high 87 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Jabin Sambrano had career-bests of five receptions for 63 yards. Senior tight end Dan Beaudin had three catches, while Reynolds and Pfahler each had two grabs.

Senior linebacker Shawn Lebsock led the Grizzlies with seven tackles, and he also had a sack. Junior free safety Erik Stoll added five tackles, while sophomore safety Mike McCord added four stops. Sophomore end Ryan Fetherston had two tackles for loss.

McKnight was just short on a 52-yard field goal try, and also had a 52-yard attempt blocked.

Montana 17 at UC Davis 10

DAVIS, CALIF. – The University of Montana Grizzlies survived another slow start, two record-setting UC Davis Aggie individual performances, and a light failure to notch a come-from-behind 17-10 road win.

The game was in question with less than a minute to go. UC Davis was knocking on the door, sitting at the Montana 12-yard line down 17-10 when things went crazy in Davis, Calif. The stadium lights failed with 57 seconds left to play, causing a lengthy delay on a 4th-and-7 from the 12-yard line. Following the delay, Griz cornerback Trumaine Johnson out-jumped Chris Carter in the end zone to snag the game-securing interception, allowing Montana to run out the clock.

Montana went with a quarterback rotation for the second game in a row. Justin Roper started the game, going 9-for-19 for 143 yards and a touchdown, and Andrew Selle threw for 83 yards on 7-of-10 passing. Running back Chase Reynolds had a game-high 90 yards on 25 carries.

Montana didn't pick up a first down until 13:48 when Roper hit Reynolds for a 12-yard strike. The success was short-lived, and the Griz again traded punts with the Aggies. Following another Grizzly defensive stop, another promising UM drive was cut short when linebacker Mike Healey stripped Marc Mariani after a reception, and UCD recovered and returned the fumble 39 yards to the UM 44. Davis couldn't capitalize, and the half ended with the Aggies leading 3-0.

UM's Jabin Sambrano returned the opening kick of the second half 35 yards to give UM great field position at near midfield, but a botched snap led to a turnover, giving the Aggies the ball at the UM 45. UCD took advantage, putting together a 13-play scoring drive, capped by a Denham 1-yard play-action pass to tight end Brad Bispo, giving the Aggies a 10-0 lead.

Montana got on the board the following possession, as Roper threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Sam Gratten in the corner of the end zone to make it 10-7 Aggies.

Montana turned it on in the fourth quarter. After Austin Mullins broke up a screen pass on third down to force the Aggies into a 38-yard field goal attempt that Kelley pushed wide right. Following the missed field goal by UCD, Montana strung together a 5-play scoring drive, highlighted by a Roper to Dan Beaudin 61 yard catch-and-run to the Davis 3. Reynolds threw a key block on that play and also got the touchdown on the next snap, a 3-yard run to the left, giving Montana its first lead, 14-10.

Davis turned the ball over on its next possession when a high shotgun snap was recovered by UM's Severin Campbell at the Aggie 20-yard line. Montana moved the ball after that and had a first-and-goal from the 5-yard line, but the Davis defense stiffened, and the Griz had to settle for a 23-yard field goal by Brody McKnight.

The 17-10 lead with 8:34 to go would be all Montana would need. Montana burned 3:30 off the clock on its next possession, giving UC Davis 67 yards to go in 2:31. A Denham pass to Carter for 42 yards picked up a large chunk of that, but the Aggies would only get to the UM 12 before the agonizing lighting delay, which lasted around 15 minutes.

Reynolds 90 yards rushing give him 1,773 in his career, moving him up to eighth on the career list. Reynolds now has 24 career touchdown runs, tying him with Tony Rice (1989-92) for the third most in school history.

Marc Mariani had a team-high 5 catches for 66 yards, while Tyler Palmer and Reynolds had 3 catches each, and tight end Dan Beaudin had 2 grabs for 72 yards, including a key career-long 61-yarder.

Safety Erik Stoll led UM with 10 tackles, while linebacker Brandon Fisher and cornerback Keith Thompson each had 8 stops. Johnson also had six tackles, including one for a loss, and he now has six career interceptions in 12 games.

UC Davis quarterback Greg Denham and Carter both set school records against Montana. Carter's 18 receptions and Denham's 43 completions were both single-game bests. Carter finished with 190 receiving yards, and Denham threw 64% (43-67) for 362 yards and a touchdown, as well as two interceptions.

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The University of Montana Grizzlies opened their 2009 Big Sky Conference season with a 49-17 victory over the visiting Portland State Vikings in front of a record crowd of 25,726 at UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The fourth-ranked (*Sports Network*) Grizzlies overcame a 14-0 first quarter deficit to win their 10<sup>th</sup> straight conference opener dating back to 1999. The Griz have now won 15 of their last 17 Big Sky openers. UM broke the attendance record it had set just two weeks ago in its season opener, 25,698 against Western State.

Montana has now defeated PSU five times in a row and in nine of the last 10 meetings.

PSU jumped to a 14-0 lead with 3:41 to go on a 38-yard pass from Drew Hubel to Lavonte Kirven. PSU scored the opening touchdown of the game on a three-yard run by Ben Bowen with 9:00 left in the first quarter.

Montana came right back, though, as Justin Roper connected with Marc Mariani for a 56-yard scoring pass to cut the Viking lead to 14-7 with 1:57 left in the first stanza.

The Grizzlies tied it 14-14 when the PSU deep snapper hiked the ball over PSU punter's head and it sailed all the way back to the goal-line, and Montana linebacker Jordan Tripp, a "true" freshman, jumped on the ball for a touchdown at the 12:58 mark in the second quarter.

Exactly five minutes later the Grizzlies scored on a four-play, 65-yard drive that took just a tick over 1:31, as sophomore Beau Donaldson plowed over the goal-line for a 1-yard touchdown, the first of his career, that coming with 7:58 left until halftime. The play that led to Donaldson's TD was a 38-yard completion from Selle to Jabin Sambrano, who was tripped up at the PSU one-yard line.

Montana gambled a bit and went ahead by two scores when they went for it on a fourth-and-three from the PSU 14-yard line, as Andrew Selle tossed a 14-yard touchdown strike to tight end Steven Pfahler, who now has three TD catches this season. Pfahler's scoring grab made it 28-14 UM, with 2:41 left until intermission.

PSU scored its final points in the closing minute (0:58) of the second quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Zach Brown, making the score 28-17 at the half.

Montana dominated the second half, as the Grizzly offense used a solid running game (28 rushes for 157 yards and a score) and mixed that in with a good passing game (214 yards and two touchdowns), outscoring the Vikings 21-0, and added a superb effort by the "D," which shut out PSU and held the Vikings to 160 total yards and seven first downs.

UM's Chase Reynolds scored the only touchdown in the third quarter on a 4-yard run. Montana had started the drive that led to Reynolds' scoring run on the PSU 29-yard line thanks to junior safety Erik Stoll, who picked off Hubel for the first interception of his career.

The Grizzlies scored twice in the final quarter, first on a 45-yard pass from Selle to Mariani, and the final score came on a 6-yard pass from Selle to Donaldson.

Selle completed 14-of-23 passes for 213 yards and three touchdowns. Roper, who suffered a jarring late hit on a broken play, but returned to the huddle after that hit, threw a 56-yard touchdown pass to Mariani on the next play, but he did not return to action after that series.

"True" freshman Peter Nguyen rushed only five times, but picked up a game-high 71 yards. Quarterback Gerald Kemp, a redshirt freshman, also sparked the team with his ball-carrying, gaining 61 yards on 11 carries. Selle rushed three times for 41 yards. Reynolds had 12 carries for a hard-earned 28 yards.

Nguyen had three punt returns for 48 yards, two kickoff returns for 43 yards, 71 rushing yards, and a catch for 10 yards for 172 all-purpose yards.

Linebacker Shawn Lebsock led Montana with 8 tackles, including one for a loss, while safety Shann Schillinger had 7 tackles and a pass break-up, and tackle Austin Mullins had 6 stops and also blocked a field goal. Defensive end Bobby Alt and linebacker Brock Coyle each had interceptions.

Montana 41, at Northern Arizona 34 (OT)

**FLAGSTAFF, ARIZ.** – The Grizzlies survived a shootout in Flagstaff, defeating the Northern Arizona Lumberjacks in overtime in the Walkup Skydome.

It was a milestone victory for seventh-year Montana mentor Bobby Hauck, as he picked up his 70th career win.

Montana held a 27-14 lead until the waning moments of the third quarter when NAU came back, starting with a 21-yard touchdown pass from Michael Herrick to Curt Sweeney. NAU added a Matt Myers 37-yard field goal and another Herrick to Sweeney 41-yard TD strike, scoring 17 unanswered points, putting the Lumberjacks up 31-27 with 3:52 remaining.

The Griz answered though, as a Jabin Sambrano kickoff return of 50 yards gave UM the ball at midfield. The drive sputtered with a false start sandwiched between a pair of short completions, but facing 3rd-and-5, wide receiver Sam Gratton reeled in a pass from Andrew Selle and took it 45 yards for the go-ahead touchdown, putting Montana up 34-31 with 2:37 to go.

NAU started its final possession at its 24, and put together an 11-play drive to set up a 47-yard field goal attempt by Mayers, a transfer from Washington State, and his three-pointer tied the game 34-all with just two seconds left.

Ty Palmer took a Selle screen pass 25 yards for a TD on the first play of overtime to put Montana ahead 41-34.

On the next play Herrick connected with halfback Alex Henderson on a play-action pass for 22 yards to the Montana 3, but Griz free safety Shann Schillinger slammed the door on the next play, intercepting a Herrick pass which was tipped by cornerback Trumaine Johnson in the end zone to secure the win for the Griz. The interception was the game's only turnover.

UM threw for 349 yards and NAU for 458. The Griz ran for 74 yards, while the Jacks had 49. UM was outgained 507-423 in total offense, but had a 12-minute edge in time of possession.

The Griz had three receivers catch six balls each: Palmer went for 87 yards and his first touchdown of the season, Gratton had 77 yards and a TD, and Mariani tallied 70 yards and a score.

Selle completed 29-38 passes for 349 yards and three touchdowns, while Herrick went 36-of-49-1 for 440 yards and four TDs, but also threw the game-ending interception.

UM's Chase Reynolds led the way on the ground with two touchdowns on 23 carries for 73 yards rushing.

The Griz started the scoring on a Reynolds 3-yard run, capping a 91-yard drive, spanning 15 plays and eating up nearly six minutes of game clock.

After that lengthy Griz drive, NAU put together a quick strike, a two-play drive covering 78 yards in just 30 seconds, Herrick throwing a 46-yard TD strike to Sweeney.

Following the NAU touchdown, Peter Nguyen returned the kickoff 61 yards to the NAU 37. Reynolds capped a 37-yard drive with a 6-yard touchdown run to put Montana up 14-7 to start the second quarter.

With his rush yards and two TDs, Reynolds moved up to sixth in career rushing yards (1,874) and 13<sup>th</sup> in career scoring (168 points).

Mariani turned a short pass from Selle into a 13-yard TD reception, capping a seven-play, 77-yard drive to push the UM lead to 21-7 with 6:21 to go in the half. The TD was Mariani's 19th of his career, moving him into a tie with former Griz Matt Wells for ninth on the team's all time list.

The Jacks drew within a touchdown in the second quarter, taking the ball 80 yards in 11 plays, and Henderson's 25-yard reception on a screen pass from Herrick made the score 21-14, UM.

Montana took possession with 1:34 left until halftime, and it looked like the score would be 21-14 at intermission, but Selle strung together five completions on six plays to get the ball into field goal range with two seconds on the clock. Brody McKnight's field goal attempt from 54 yards out was good, giving McKnight his career-long and the Griz a 10-point (24-14) halftime edge.

McKnight added a 21-yard field goal at the 6:55 mark of the third quarter, pushing the Griz lead to 13 (27-14), but NAU stormed back, setting up the late-game drama and come-from-behind overtime victory for the fourth-ranked Grizzlies.

MISSOULA, MONTANA – The fourth-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies used a dominate second half to defeat the 15<sup>th</sup>-ranked Cal Poly Mustangs 35-23 in a non-league game Saturday afternoon in Washington-Grizzly Stadium in UM's annual homecoming game.

A crowd of 25,694 braved frigid temperatures (25 degrees at kickoff) to see the Grizzlies win their 17<sup>th</sup> homecoming game in a row. It was the third largest crowd ever in 172 games at Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

Cal Poly (2-3) took a 17-14 lead at half, controlled the game with their option attack, and also shut down Montana's (5-0) offense in the opening 30 minutes.

The Mustangs of the Great West Conference jumped to a 10-0 lead with 11:19 to go until intermission on a 32-yard field goal by kicker Chris Pinto. Cal Poly took a 7-0 first-quarter lead on a methodical, 83-yard 10-play drive, with quarterback Tony Smith scoring on a 1-yard run.

The Grizzlies got their initial first down of the game in grand fashion, as wide receiver Marc Mariani hauled in a short pass and then out-raced the Mustangs' defense for an 84-yard touchdown reception on a pass from quarterback Justin Roper. Mariani's grab, which tied him for the sixth longest in school history, cut the Cal Poly lead to 10-7 with 8:15 remaining until halftime.

The Mustangs got great field position when Ryan Taylor recovered a fumble punt return by Mariani, giving the Mustangs the ball on the UM 20-yard line. Six plays later Cal Poly fullback Jordan Yocum scored on a 1-yard plunge, giving his team a 17-7 lead with 1:08 left until half.

But Montana's offense started to come to life, and just 48 seconds after Yocum's score, Griz halfback Chase Reynolds took a screen pass from quarterback Andrew Selle for a 35-yard touchdown, reducing the Cal Poly lead to 17-14 with 28 ticks left until the half.

Neither team scored in the third quarter, but the Grizzlies scored back-to-back touchdowns in the final stanza and took a 28-17 lead when Mariani hauled in a 68-yard pass from Selle with 9:03 left to play.

Earlier in the final quarter, Reynolds gave Montana what proved to be the lead for good, when he scored on a 3-yard run with 14:28 remaining in the contest. Reynolds was a work-horse on that scoring drive, rushing 10 times for 59 yards and three first downs.

Cal Poly did not go away, though, as just 32 seconds after the Grizzlies had taken their 11-point (28-17) lead, the Mustangs scored on a 59-yard bomb from quarterback Harlan Prather to wide receiver Mike Anderson. Prather, who had replaced Smith who was injured early in the game, was errant on a two-point pass conversion, and Montana led 28-23 with 8:23 left to play.

The Grizzlies then used up valuable time and got a much-needed insurance touchdown, as Reynolds hauled in a pass from Selle for an 8-yard touchdown with 3:24 left in the contest, capping off a nine-play 62-yard drive that took almost five minutes (4:54) off the clock.

In the second half, UM out-gained Cal Poly 277 to 112 in total yards, had nine more first downs (14 to 5), and had the ball almost eight minutes (17:39 to 12:21) more in time of possession.

Reynolds rushed 29 times for 109 yards and a touchdown, and also caught 2 passes, both for scores.

Mariani had game-highs of 6 receptions for 200 yards and a pair of TDs. Selle was 9-of-17-0 for 155 yards and 3 touchdowns, while Roper completed 5-of-10 passes for 123 yards and a score, but was picked off twice.

Griz DT Austin Mullins had a team-high 10 tackles, while linebackers Shawn Lebsock and Brandon Fisher and end Jace Palmer each had 8 stops.

Yocum rushed for 119 yards on 24 carries and scored once, while Smith had 7 totes for 21 yards and a touchdown. Smith was 7-of-14-0 passing for 86 yards.

## At Montana 41, Eastern Washington 34

MISSOULA, MONTANA —The third-ranked and never-say-die University of Montana Grizzlies put together a scoring drive in the final few minutes to up-end the 21-st ranked Eagles in a Big Sky Conference match-up in front of a record crowd (25,751) at UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

The victory gave Montana its 24th winning season in a row, starting in 1986.

Montana's final scoring drive was an 11-play, 55-yarder that culminated when halfback Chase Reynolds scored on a 4<sup>th</sup>-and-goal from the 1-yard line, which gave the Grizzlies a 41-34 lead with 1:18 remaining in the game.

After Reynolds had scored the go-ahead touchdown, EWU took over on its own 20-yard line and advanced the ball to its own 49-yard line, but its drive stopped there, as quarterback Matt Nichols threw four straight incompletions.

EWU had tied the game up at 34-all on a 1-yard scoring run by halfback Taiwan Jones with 4:58 remaining.

After Jones' game-tying run, Montana's Jabin Sambrano gave UM good field position, returning the kickoff 26 yards to the Montana 45-yard line, setting the stage for the Grizzlies' go-ahead scoring drive.

The Grizzlies took their biggest lead on their second possession of the third quarter, as quarterback Andrew Selle connected with wide receiver Tyler Palmer in the left corner of the end zone for an 18-yard touchdown pass, which gave UM a 27-13 advantage with 6:09 to go in the third quarter.

EWU came right back, though, and scored twice, the first a 14-yard TD pass from Nichols to Ashton Gant, and the second a 50-yard scoring strike from Nichols to Aaron Boyce. Boyce's touchdown catch came with nine seconds left in the third quarter and tied the game at 27-27.

Montana's prolific receiver/returner Marc Mariani regained the lead for the Griz with 10:11 left in the contest, returning a punt 82 yards for a touchdown. It was Mariani's third career score on a punt return.

EWU marched down the field on its opening drive and took a 7-0 lead on a 13-yard scoring pass from Nichols to tight end Nathan Overbay. UM got on the scoreboard when a bad snap sailed over the EWU punter's head and that safety made it 7-2, Eagles. Eastern Washington closed out the first-quarter scoring on a 39-yard field goal by Mike Jarrett, giving the Eagles a 10-2 lead at the 2:44 mark.

The Griz scored the next 18 points, however, to take a 20-10 lead with 1:05 left until intermission. Montana's scoring during that 11-minute surge started with a 27-yard field goal by McKnight. That was followed by a 2-yard scoring pass from QB Justin Roper to tight end Rob Overton (Overton's first career score) and a run by Mariani for a two-point conversion, and a 16-yard run by Reynolds. EWU's Jarrett kicked a 48-yard field goal as time expired to cut UM's halftime lead to 20-13.

Reynolds led UM with 21 carries for 69 yards and two scores, while Thomas Brooks-Fletcher gained 50 yards on 11 carries, and Roper picked up 32 yards on four totes.

Reynolds moved up to fourth on UM's career rushing list with 2,052 yards, passing Steve Caputo (2,033, 1969-71), and he also became the fourth player in school history to rush for more than 2,000 yards. Reynolds also moved up to eighth in career scoring with 198 points.

Selle was 11-of-18-0 for 150 yards and a touchdown, while Roper was 6-of-8-0 for 59 yards and a score. Tight end Steve Pfahler led UM with career-highs of 5 catches for 79 yards, while Mariani had 3 grabs for 50 yards, and Palmer and Reynolds has 2 receptions apiece.

Linebacker Shawn Lebsock and strong safety Erik Stoll led the Griz with a team-high 9 tackles each, while cornerback Keith Thompson had 8 stops. Tackles Austin Mullins and Tyler Hobbs each had a sack for Montana.

Jones rushed 17 times for 145 yards and a score. Nichols was 32-of-49-0 for 312 yards and 3 touchdowns. Slot back Tony Davis led EWU with 8 catches for 59 yards, while Boyce had 7 grabs for a game-high 114 yards and a TD. EWU linebacker J.C. Sherritt had a game-high 17 tackles.

SACRAMENTO, CALIF. – Chase Reynolds and Thomas Brooks-Fletcher combined for 245 rushing yards and four touchdowns to lead the second-ranked Grizzlies (7-0/4-0).

On the opening drive for Montana, Andrew Selle found Marc Mariani over the middle for an 18-yard TD pass.

The Grizzlies' early 7-0 lead didn't last long, though, as the Hornets (2-5/2-3) marched down the field, scoring a touchdown on a 3-yard run by halfback Terrance Dailey.

With a 7-7 tie to start the second quarter, Sac State completed a 25-yard pass from quarterback Jason Smith to receiver John Hendershott, giving the Hornets a 14-7 lead at the 14:13 mark of the second quarter.

The Grizzlies answered with two touchdowns by running back Chase Reynolds on back-to-back possessions. The go-ahead touchdown was set up by a successful on-side kick which was recovered by redshirt freshman quarterback Gerald Kemp on the Sac 49-yard line.

The two touchdown runs by Reynolds were 2-and 1-yarders, the second giving the Griz a 21-14 lead with 2:06 left in the half, and Montana led the rest of the way.

In the closing seconds of the first half, the Hornets had a 40-yard touchdown reception called back on a holding call, and the Grizzlies led 21-14 at intermission.

Reynolds scored his third touchdown of the game and 13th of the season after Marc Mariani returned a Hornet's punt 54 yards to the Sac 5-yard line. Reynolds' third touchdown run of the afternoon came on the first play from scrimmage after Mariani's punt return, and gave Montana a 28-14 advantage with 9:32 left in the third quarter.

Sac State responded with an eight-play scoring drive to pull within a score, as quarterback Jason Smith connected with wide receiver John Hendershott for a TD pass for the second in the game, cutting the Grizzly lead to 28-21.

On its next drive, Montana took the ball down to the Sac 31-yard line and then successfully completed a fake field goal, as holder Jeff Larson ran for 14 yards to the Hornet 17 for a key first down. Two plays later Brooks-Fletcher scored on a 17-yard run, making it 35-21 UM with 1:07 left in the third stanza.

The trick play kept Montana driving. Two plays later, Brooks-Fletcher ran for a 17-yard touchdown, giving the Grizzlies a 35-21 lead. The score was Brooks-Fletcher's first touchdown of the season and fifth of his career.

On Sac's first drive of the fourth quarter, Griz safety Mike Cummings picked off a pass at the UM 24, and the Grizzlies then put together an 11-play, 56-yard drive that took almost five minutes (4:53), and Griz kicker Brody McKnight gave his team a three-score lead, connecting on a 38-yard field goal. McKnight's three-pointer gave the Griz a 38-21 lead with 8:04 left to play.

Sac State cut Montana's lead to 38-28 on a 28-yard TD pass from Smith to Brett Willis with 5:06 remaining on the clock.

Sophomore wide receiver Jabin Sambrano helped extend the Grizzlies lead with a 57-yard touchdown reception on a screen play, giving Montana a 45-28 lead with 3:35 left.

The Hornets scored the final points of the game with a safety, giving Sac State two points and the ball, and the Hornets still had hope, but linebacker Caleb McSurdy sealed the victory for Montana with an interception.

Montana finished the game with 471 yards of total offense. Quarterback Andrew Selle started the game and was 9-of-15-0 for 109 yards and a touchdown. Justin Roper rotated at QB, going 9-of-11-1 for 127 yards and a score.

Brooks-Fletcher had 22 carries for a career-high 133 yards – his fourth career 100-yard game. Reynolds had 20 totes for 112 yards and three TDs, and he now has 11 career 100-yard rushing games and has rushed for 11 TDs this season.

Mariani had four catches for 36 yards and a TD, while Sambrano had four grabs for a team-high 114 yards, and tight ends Dan Beaudin and Steve Pfahler had two grabs each.

Cornerbacks Donny Lisowski and Brandon Dodson had a team-high seven tackles each, as did linebacker Shawn Lebsock. Dodson also had a sack, a forced fumble and PD.

Sac's Smith was 31-of-46-2 for 323 yards and three TDs. Junior receiver Brandyn Reed led the Hornets with 10 catches for 111 yards. Dailey rushed 19 times for 90 yards and a score. Linebacker Peter Buck had a game-high 18 tackles.

**MISSOULA, MONTANA --** Running back Chase Reynolds rushed 33 times for a career-high 241 yards and a touchdown, and the defense stymied one of the best offenses in the Football Championship Subdivision, as the host and second-ranked Grizzlies defeated the 14th-ranked Wildcats in a pivotal Big Sky Conference game.

The Grizzlies set a Washington-Grizzly Stadium attendance record for the fifth time in five home games this season, as 25,811 fans saw the Grizzlies stay unbeaten at 8-0 and improve to 5-0 in the conference. The Wildcats are 5-4 overall and 5-2 in the Big Sky.

Montana set the tone early, going 75 yards on 10 plays in its first drive, with Andrew Selle throwing a 3-yard touchdown pass to tight end Dan Beaudin, giving UM a 7-0 lead.

The Grizzlies took a two-touchdown lead later in the opening quarter when UM defensive end Jace Palmer intercepted a pass by WSU quarterback Cameron Higgins and raced 57 yards for his first-ever collegiate touchdown. The extra point snap was errant and Montana was unable to get the PAT attempt off, and led 13-0 with 2:05 left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats, who entered the contest ranked fourth in the FCS in passing yards a game (307.0 ypg) and eighth in total offense (440.8 ypg), scored just three first-half points, as Mike Snoy hit a 36-yard field goal at the 10:56 mark of the second quarter, and Montana led 13-3 at intermission.

Montana scored the only points in the third quarter on a six-play, 81-yard drive which culminated with a 2-yard touchdown run by Reynolds. It was all Chase Reynolds on that drive, as the junior from Drummond carried the ball four times for 58 yards.

Kicker Brody McKnight gave Montana a 20-point cushion with 14:09 left on a 42-yard field goal, making it 23-3 Grizzlies.

WSU scored its only TD of the game on a flea-flicker play, as halfback Bob Bolen took a hand-off, pitched the ball back to Higgins, and Higgins lofted a 59-yard scoring pass to Mike Phillips, cutting the UM lead to 23-10 with 11:15 to go.

After a three-and-out by both teams, Montana put together another impressive scoring drive, going 79 yards on eight plays, as Selle hit halfback Thomas Brooks-Fletcher on a screen pass which resulted in a 14-yard touchdown and a 31-10 lead by the Griz with 4:52 remaining.

Reynolds was the catalyst again on UM's final scoring drive, as he picked up 53 yards on five totes, although a Selle to Marc Mariani 17-yard hook-up, which gave the Grizzlies a first-and-10 on the WSU 4-yard line, was also a key play. An illegal use of hands penalty by the Grizzlies moved the ball back to the Wildcat 14, but on the next play after the penalty, Selle hit Brooks-Fletcher, whose 14-yard touchdown was his first career receiving touchdown.

The Grizzly defense limited the Wildcats to 299 total yards (26 carries for 56 yards rushing, 243 yards passing), and picked off four of Higgins' passes.

Montana cornerback Trumaine Johnson, who missed last Saturday's game at Sac State due to injury, had a team-high 8 tackles, two picks, and two pass deflections. Johnson now has eight career interceptions in two-plus seasons.

Cornerback Andrew Swink added 6 tackles and a pick, while end Severin Campbell added five stops, a sack, and 2 tackles for loss.

The Grizzlies racked up 506 total yards (52 rushes for 288 yards and 218 yards passing), and had 11 more (24 to 13) first downs.

Reynolds, who rushed 21 times for 193 yards in the second half, had a previous career-high of 233 yards rushing against Texas State in a first round FCS playoff game last season. Reynolds now has 822 yards rushing this season, which ranks him 16<sup>th</sup> in single-season history. His 2,405 career rushing yards move him up to third all-time, as he passed Rocky Klever (2,228 yards, 1977-71). Selle was 13-of-26-0 for 214 yards and two touchdowns. Selle has thrown for 1,829 career yards, which ranks him 17<sup>th</sup> on the career list.

Mariani had team-highs of 4 receptions for 98 yards, while Jabin Sambrano caught three balls for 20 yards, and Steve Pfahler, Brooks-Fletcher and Beaudin had two grabs each. Beaudin's touchdown grab was the first for him this season and the fourth in his career.

POCATELLO, IDAHO -- Kicker Brody McKnight hit a 33-yard field goal with no time remaining to keep the Grizzlies (9-0/6-0 Big Sky) unbeaten.

Montana's final possession began at the UM 17 with 1:25 to go, the Griz trailing 10-9. Quarterback Andrew Selle was 3-of-5 passing on the game-winning drive. All three completions were big gainers, including a 39-yard strike to Marc Mariani to move Montana to the ISU 15. Chase Reynolds followed that up with a 14-yard carry to the 1-yard line. A Reynolds goal line dive couldn't break through, and after Selle spiked the ball to stop the clock at 0:09, an offensive pass interference penalty moved the field goal try back 15 yards.

ISU called two timeouts to ice McKnight, but the sophomore kicker stayed perfect from inside 40 yards and sealed the game for the Griz.

Montana outgained Idaho State 492-309, including a hefty 335-198 passing advantage, but the Griz had 129 penalty yards and three turnovers.

Mariani, Montana's player of the game, caught 8 balls for 192 yards. Selle was 19-28 for 321 yards and an interception. Reynolds ran 22 times for 123 yards, while Thomas Brooks-Fletcher had UM's lone touchdown.

ISU's Russel Hill threw for 198 yards, going 23-36 with a TD and an interception. Clint Knickrehm had 102 rushing yards on 19 carries.

After forcing the Bengals to punt on the opening drive, Montana's offense started off with a 10-play drive that gained 81 yards; 42 of those came when Selle hit Mariani down the right sideline, moving the Griz to the ISU 7. The drive was stalled by an illegal block, and UM eventually settled for a McKnight 27-yard field goal.

The Bengals answered with a field goal of their own, a 25-yard effort from Jarrett Huk, on a 14-play, 79-yard drive, aided by two UM penalties for 25 yards.

The Griz got on the board again in the second quarter when Thomas Brooks-Fletcher ran up the middle for a 1-yard TD. A personal foul after the UM touchdown moved the conversion back 15 yards, and McKnight's kick attempted was blocked by Michael Wright to leave the score 9-3.

Things got crazy after halftime. A holding call nullified a 66-yard Mariani punt return for a touchdown, and neither team found success in the third quarter.

Montana was driving following a combined four straight punts to start the second half, when ISU stopped the Griz at the ISU 36 and took the ball over on downs. The Bengals immediately turned it over when Hill, trying to avoid an Austin Mullins sack, attempted to throw the ball away, but the pass went straight to Montana linebacker Josh Stuber at the ISU 36. Stuber returned the pick to the 32.

The Griz were driving the short field, but that possession fell apart when A.J. Storms recovered a Montana fumble. A Carson Bender sack ended the ensuing Bengal drive, forcing a punt, but the turnover frenzy continued when Selle threw an interception to Keith McGowen, setting up ISU at its own 44-yard line.

The Bengals were finally able to capitalize on the Montana miscue, putting together a 9-play, 56-yard touchdown drive, capped by Hill's 21-yard slant pass to Kelvin Krosch. Huk's extra point gave the Bengals their first lead (10-9) of the game with 10:29 to go.

Montana gave the ball away again when ISU's Sean Rutten forced Selle to fumble following an 8-yard carry. It was recovered by Chris Holmesly to give the Bengals the ball at their 17. The teams then traded punts, and ISU had the lead and the ball with 3:50 left.

The Griz defense allowed only 19 yards in six plays while burning only 2:25 off the game clock. Jon Vanderwielen's 44-yard punt out-of-bounds to the UM 17 set up Montana's final drive.

## At Montana 31, Northern Colorado 10

Junior running back Chase Reynolds rushed for 151 yards and three touchdowns to lead the top-ranked (FCS Coaches' Poll) University of Montana Grizzlies to a Big Sky Conference regular-season championship with a 31-10 victory over the visiting University of Northern Colorado Bears.

It is the 12<sup>th</sup> straight Big Sky championship for the Grizzlies, who remained unbeaten at 10-0 and are now 7-0 in league games. Montana has gone 30-1 in conference games the last four seasons and won 42-of-43 regular-season games.

The Grizzlies overcame an early 7-0 deficit, and took a 14-7 halftime lead when junior quarterback Justin Roper connected with senior wide receiver Tyler Palmer on a 19-yard touchdown pass with 28 seconds to go until intermission.

Montana outscored Northern Colorado (3-8/1-7) 24-3 in the final half, thanks in large part to touchdown runs of 54 and 37 yards by Reynolds.

Neither teams scored in the opening quarter, but the Bears took a 7-0 lead at the 13:29 mark of the second quarter on an 18-yard scoring pass from senior quarterback Bryan Waggener to senior wide receiver Alex Thompson.

Montana came right back, though, and scored on its next possession after UNC's scoring pass. Reynolds was a workhorse on the Grizzlies' 12-play, 59-yard scoring drive, rushing nine times for 24 hard-earned yards, including the tying TD.

The Grizzlies took the lead for good right before halftime, going 80 yards on 11 plays, that go-ahead score coming on the Roper to Palmer touchdown pass.

Reynolds' back-to-back long scoring runs gave the Grizzlies a 28-7 advantage with 12:03 left in the third quarter.

The Bears got their final points of the afternoon on a 25-yard field goal by senior kicker Michael York, making the score 28-10 Grizzlies with 3:29 left in the third stanza.

A 20-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Brody McKnight and a 32-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback Andrew Selle to senior wide receiver Marc Mariani closed out the scoring.

Reynolds rushed 23 times for his 151 yards, and had just seven carries for 107 yards and a pair of TDs in the second half. He also had three catches for 26 yards.

Reynolds now has 1,096 yards rushing for 15 touchdowns this season. He is the 10<sup>th</sup> player in school history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season. It is the third for a UM player to go over the 1,000-yard plateau twice, as Reynolds joins Yohance Humphery (1,658 yards in 2001 and 1,277 yards in 1999) and Lex Hilliard (1,322 yards in 2005 and 1,132 yards in 2007) to accomplish that feat. Reynolds rushed for 1,583 yards last season.

Roper was 13-of-20-0 for 123 yards and a touchdown, while Selle was 6-of-9-1 for 72 yards and a score. Mariani had three grabs for 49 yards and a TD, while Palmer had three catches for 43 yards and a touchdown. Nine different players caught passes for Montana.

Griz senior linebacker Shawn Lebsock had a team-high nine tackles; junior safety Erik Stoll added eight stops; and sophomore LB Alex Shaw added seven tackles; Junior end Severin Campbell had four tackles, including two for losses and a sack.

Waggener was 26-of-44-1 for 200 yards and a touchdown. UNC sophomore wide receiver Patrick Walker had game-highs of 12 catches for 82 yards.

Montana out-gained Northern Colorado in total yards, 438 to 254, including a lop-sided 243 to 54 in rushing yards.
